

Site: Kidron Valley also know as the Valley of Jehoshaphat

Scripture References: 1 Chronicles 24:15; Joel 3:1-2; 14

Historical Significance:

1. A wadi about 3 miles north to south that lies between Jerusalem and the Mount of Olives. This valley is the site of four tombs: Absalom's Pillar; Tomb of Jehoshaphat; Grotto of St. James and Tomb of Zechariah. Historical accounts suggest that the names do not represented who is buried in these tombs.

Things to look for:

1. Pharaoh's hat and Absalom's Pillar are 1st century memorials.
2. Zechariah's tomb is actually a 2nd century memorial

What does this site teach us about God?

1. This valley is also called the Valley of Decision where the Lord will decide about mankind, not mankind about the Lord.
2. We can choose to live for Him as we look forward to our own resurrection one day.
