***2 Chronicles 20:9,11-18 KJV***

*If, when evil cometh upon us, as the sword, judgment, or pestilence, or famine, we stand before this house, and in thy presence, (for thy name is in this house,) and cry unto thee in our affliction, then thou wilt hear and help. [11] Behold, I say, how they reward us, to come to cast us out of thy possession, which thou hast given us to inherit. [12] O our God, wilt thou not judge them? for we have no might against this great company that cometh against us; neither know we what to do: but our eyes are upon thee. [13] And all Judah stood before the LORD, with their little ones, their wives, and their children. [14] Then upon Jahaziel the son of Zechariah, the son of Benaiah, the son of Jeiel, the son of Mattaniah, a Levite of the sons of Asaph, came the Spirit of the LORD in the midst of the congregation; [15] And he said, Hearken ye, all Judah, and ye inhabitants of Jerusalem, and thou king Jehoshaphat, Thus saith the LORD unto you, Be not afraid nor dismayed by reason of this great multitude; for the battle is not yours, but God's. [16] To morrow go ye down against them: behold, they come up by the cliff of Ziz; and ye shall find them at the end of the brook, before the wilderness of Jeruel. [17] Ye shall not need to fight in this battle: set yourselves, stand ye still, and see the salvation of the LORD with you, O Judah and Jerusalem: fear not, nor be dismayed; to morrow go out against them: for the LORD will be with you. [18] And Jehoshaphat bowed his head with his face to the ground: and all Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem fell before the LORD, worshipping the LORD.*

***“Aluta Continua”***  
***“The Struggle Continues”***

***“Aluta continua”*** is a phrase from Portuguese that means ***“The struggle continues.”***

It became widely known during African liberation movements, especially in Mozambique (mow-zam-beek), where it was associated with the fight for independence. The full slogan is often:

***“Aluta continua, a vitória é certa.”***

***“The struggle continues, victory is certain.”***

Today, the phrase is often used to express:

- ***Perseverance in the face of hardship***
- ***Commitment to a cause or mission***
- ***Refusal to give up despite obstacles***
- ***Hope that present struggles will eventually produce victory***

In a spiritual or ministry context, it can carry the sense of:

***“The journey is not over. The opposition has not stopped the assignment. We continue forward in faith until God’s purpose is fulfilled.”***

***2 Corinthians 1:8-10 KJV***

*For we would not, brethren, have you ignorant of our trouble which came to us in Asia, that we were pressed out of measure, above strength, insomuch that we despaired even of life: [9] But we had the sentence of death in ourselves, that we should not trust in ourselves, but in God which raiseth the dead: [10] Who delivered us from so great a death, and doth deliver: in whom we trust that he will yet deliver us;*

***“Aluta continua — the struggle continues, but so does the grace of God, the call of God, and the purpose of God.”***

This powerful declaration reminds us that the presence of struggle is not the absence of victory. The battle may continue, the process may be long, and the road may be difficult, but the outcome has already been settled in faith.

For the believer, it speaks to a holy perseverance:

- ***The struggle continues—but so does God’s strength.***
- ***The pressure continues—but so does God’s grace.***
- ***The opposition continues—but so does God’s purpose.***
- ***The journey continues—but so does God’s faithfulness.***

As the Apostle Paul declared:

***“And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not.” — Galatians 6:9***

And again:

***“Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us.” — Romans 8:37***

***Aluta continua.***

The pain may continue.

The building process may continue.

The waiting may continue.

The sacrifices may continue.

***Mas a vitória é certa.***

The promise is certain.

The calling is certain.

The provision is certain.

The victory is certain.
