Greetings From Paul

Titus 1:1-4

1. Paul begins his letter to Titus by introducing himself as a slave to Christ, meaning that he is in complete bondage to God in thought, word, effort, purpose, and plan. Does your life represent slavery to God when it comes to your thought life, your words, your effort, purpose, and plan?
1 Corinthians 6:20; 1 Peter 1:18-19; 2 Corinthians 5:15
2. Paul shows us this roadmap for believers by his actions. First, he is called to share the gospel, then disciple others to know the truth that leads to godly living. As you reflect on Paul's assignment...first, have you responded to the gospel message? Are you repentant, and is there evidence of repentance in your pursuit of Christ? If you have, are you preaching the gospel? Are you teaching others to know the truth? How passionate are you to deliver the gospel of Christ to the world?
Ephesians 4:11-13; 1 Peter 2:1-3; 2 Peter 3:18
3. This text reminds us that it is the Word of God that changes lives. Where are you investing in your study of his word? Who are you investing with? How are you investing? Does anything need to change in your heart, in your schedule, or in your priorities, so that the Word of God can change your life?

4. Paul closes his greeting by saying May God the Father and Christ Jesus our Savior give you grace and peace. This reminds us that we can't have peace without grace, and God the Father and Christ the Son are the only true source for both. In light of that, where do you search for peace? What are some of your false resting places? When you think about peace, are you simply craving rest and relaxation, or are you longing for Christ?

5. Continuing with the reminder that God is our source for grace, where are you ignoring grace and, as a result, having no peace? With God? Toward others? From God?
