Family

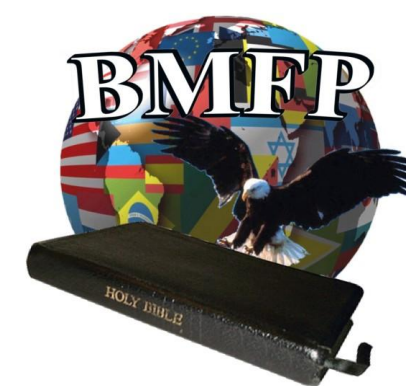
