God continues to answer prayers! We found a German language class that the children and Tabitha can take together. Classes start in September. We are excited for this next phase moving forward in the ministry that God has called us to here. Next month, Brandon will be starting the third level of German.



The church we are serving in needed an update to their nursery. Brandon put in new lights, and we all worked together to give it a fresh coat of paint. There is a great group of teens at the church now. We were blessed to lead a teen night. Twelve children came, and everyone enjoyed food, games, and a devotion given by Brandon. This past month, Tabitha had an opportunity to teach a Bible study at a lady's meeting. While at the park, one of our children shared the gospel with another child that was there. She spoke with the child for a while and then brought him to us. We gave him a tract to take home and encouraged him to talk to his parents about it. God's timing is spectacular. The boy told us that his family was moving out of the country three days later. Please pray that the seed planted will be used to lead his family to the Lord.



Our family was able to help with VBS again this year at the church where we stayed last year when we first moved to Germany. This was Wesley's first time going to class on his own. He has not stopped talking about his teachers and all of the fun things he did. We love the church family there! It was so refreshing being with them. We praise God for the precious new friends He gave us that week.



The day after we got home from VBS, Logan ate a granola bar that contained roasted peanuts. His body reacted the instant he swallowed his bite. Tabitha was home alone and had to administer an Epi-Pen for the first time. It was traumatic for them both!! We had just taken our van to the shop that morning, so she had to call an ambulance to take them to the hospital. Thankfully our amazing friend came to stay with the other kids while we left. Logan had to spend the night at the hospital to monitor his vitals. The doctors wanted to ensure that he wouldn't have another reaction once the epinephrine wore off. A nurse told us that parents are not allowed to stay with their children in the hospital when a child is over eight years old. Thankfully an exception was made, and Tabitha was allowed to stay with him! Private rooms are not standard here; if you choose to get one, you will pay over a thousand dollars extra. Typically there are at least three people in a room. Thankfully God allowed us to have a room to ourselves. Praise God, Logan was discharged the following afternoon and is now completely back to normal.
