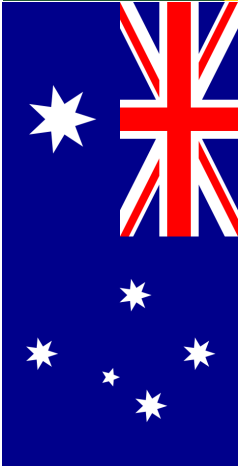
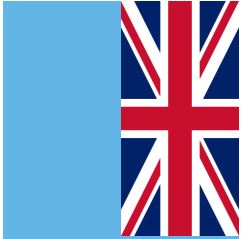

“Full on” is an Aussie slang expression which means “intense, overwhelming, hectic or extreme”. We’ve been **full on** for about five months now! So much has been happening, thank you for your continued prayer and financial support.

Bonnie is dealing with spinal nerve pain again. We needed to make sure that her pain was not heart related, so Bonnie spent several days in the hospital. Although somewhat costly, friends and churches gave and the bills were met completely. More wonderful, was that the results were great! The cardiologist examined her last surgery and said that the previous stint placement was doing very well, there was no buildup in the arteries, and the heart was not the source of the pain she has been in. Further tests and visits to doctors have followed; Bonnie has three bulges of the spine pressing on the spinal cord, but she is improving slowly with visits to a physio-therapist. She continues to school teach to supplement our income, she teaches Sunday School and leads women’s Bible studies and young ladies youth meetings also. There is some sluggish movement in the lymphatic system, and to top it off this week she developed shingles. Please pray for Bonnie.

We would especially appreciate prayer for us as we seek to share the gospel with others; a young lady that Bonnie teaches with (and her baby girl) were tragically murdered last month. The mother of the young lady is a deputy principal Bonnie had worked with, and there’s the teachers that Bonnie meets with every Friday that were close to them all. We sense that some are seeking answers, pray for us as we hope to have opportunity to share the gospel.

In November I was able to travel to Papua New Guinea for the first time. I was there to meet the church and pastor that is responsible for sending PNGian missionary Dominic Kelly and his family to the Solomon Islands. Besides planting a church, Bro. Dominic will act as our “on ground” principal of our Bible College there in the Islands. We also gained another two ministerial students in Papua New Guinea. PNG is a rough place, there are over 800 tribal languages and is the poorest nation in the Oceanic.

There was at least one profession of faith in Christ at the youth camp I preached at in Fiji in January.

This past month (March) I was in the Solomon Islands for three weeks. We’re setting up the Bible College so we can reach more students by video conferencing. I also had the opportunity to preach at the Pacific Light Baptist Church, where Joseph Iro (our first graduate) is now pastoring. Missionary Michael Deatrick and Joseph have been doing a good job, it was very encouraging to see how the church has grown and progressed. More and more I am encouraged to concentrate specifically on the Solomon Islands.

Back here in Australia we’ve had a Youth Camp this month, I continue to preach, pastor and teach. Thank you for your continued faithfulness to the Lord and to us.
