The Saturday ladies' Bible study in Asuret village is going well. Half of our ladies are quite elderly, and I have to pick up some of them in my truck. This past Saturday, instead of the usual requesting of prayer for different ailments, most were praising the Lord that they are well!

Thank you for praying for Peninnah, the elderly lady with bad sores on her leg. She has started to improve. We meet under the mango tree in her yard, and she is now able to join us by walking slowly with a walker. The family of a little girl who is lame heard about our Bible study, and they carry her to our Bible study since they live close by. The girl had been asking them to take her to hear the Bible. She has been coming for around a year now. Close to Easter, I gave her a New Testament coloring book, some crayons and some candy. She was delighted!

The first term of our Uganda school year is coming to an end in two weeks. Since school started late because of presidential elections, the term has been too short. Teachers have struggled to complete the curriculum requirements. I managed to get work for my classes finished. Please continue to pray for our new orphans. As I mentioned in my last letter, some of them are older children who never had a chance to go to school and need to learn to read and write. Since the term ends soon, please pray for our children for safety as they return to their villages for a short school break. God grant them a happy break!

Our Soroti church has just started a youth program that meets on Wednesday nights while the adults have prayer service. Please pray for this ministry, which involves local youth as well as our own orphans. May they grow in grace!

Thank you for your prayers for our Soroti team (Sutphen family, Gardner family, Sarah Shadrick, Debbie Guimon and me). As I mentioned in my last prayer letter, Matthew Gardner's wife Savannah was killed in December. He is returning in May to continue working together with us here in Soroti. Pray for God's comfort and the adjustments he and his boys will have to make as they labor here without Savannah. Also, Alan's wife, Elena Sutphen, has broken her leg and is having to be in a cast for around two more months. My psoriasis is up-and-down. It will start to improve and then get worse. So, I am still on methotrexate, but I am glad to report that there was no cold virus circulated through our school this first term!
