Reflection and Preparation

Maundy Thursday is the Thursday of Holy Week, the night Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper and on which he was betrayed. The name derives from the Latin *mandatum novum*, the "new commandment" that Jesus taught his disciples on the night in which he washed their feet, "Love one another, even as I have loved you." Christians have observed Maundy Thursday for centuries as a vivid reminder of Christ's self-giving love and his call to us to share in that love and to make it known in our lives.

PASTOR: We remember this night as the night of our Lord's betrayal. We remember this night as a dark night, yet one that led to the breaking of the dawn.

PEOPLE: **We remember this night as a night of deep sorrows, yet one that will give way to our deepest joy.** *Silent Prayer*

PASTOR: Jesus said, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another just as I have loved you, you are also to love one another."

ALL: **On this night, Jesus the Lamb of God gave himself into the hands of those who would slay him. On this night, Jesus yearned to be with his disciples in the upper room. On this night, Jesus took a towel and washed his disciples' feet, giving us an example that we should do to others as he has done to us.**

PASTOR: On this night, Jesus our God gave us a holy feast, that we who eat this bread and drink this cup may here proclaim his holy sacrifice and be partakers of his resurrection, and reign with him in the New Creation. Amen.

Prayer of the Night

PASTOR: Let us pray:

ALL: **Holy God, Source of all love, on the night in which he was given up or rather gave himself up for the life of the world, the Word who was made flesh gave his disciples a new commandment, to love one another even as he loved them. Write this commandment upon our hearts; give us the will to serve others, as we have been and are served by him who suffered and died for us on the cross and yet who is even now alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.**

Confession of Sin

PASTOR: Holy and merciful God,

ALL: **We confess to you, and to one another, and to the whole communion of saints in heaven and on earth, that we have sinned by our own fault, in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.**

PASTOR: We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind, and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others as we ourselves have been forgiven.

PEOPLE: **Have mercy on us, O Lord.**

PASTOR: We have not listened to your call to serve as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved your Holy Spirit.

PEOPLE: **Have mercy on us, O Lord.**

PASTOR: We confess to you, O God, all our past unfaithfulness: the pride, hypocrisy, and impatience in our lives, as well as our self-indulgent appetites and ways of exploiting other people,

PEOPLE: **This we confess to you, O God.**

PASTOR: Our anger at our own frustration and our envy of those more fortunate than ourselves,

PEOPLE: This we confess to you, O God.
PASTOR: Our intemperate love of worldly goods and comforts and our dishonesty in daily life and work,
PEOPLE: This we confess to you, O God.
PASTOR: Our negligence in prayer and worship and our failure to commend the faith that is in us,
PEOPLE: This we confess to you, O God.
PASTOR: Accept our repentance, O God for the wrongs we have done. For our neglect of human need and suffering and our indifference to injustice and cruelty,
PEOPLE: Accept our repentance, O God.
PASTOR: For our false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts toward neighbors, and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us,
PEOPLE: Accept our repentance, O God.
PASTOR: For our waste and pollution of your creation and our lack of concern for those who come after us,
PEOPLE: Accept our repentance, O God.
PASTOR: Restore us, O God, and let your anger depart from us.
ALL: Favorably hear us, O God, for your mercy is great. Amen.
