

SEASONS

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- In ministry, one of the greatest realities that enable us to remain steadfast is when we recognize that God isn't just LORD OF THE HARVEST, but He is also LORD OF THE SEASONS.
- 2025 was a year that the Lord brought to me a fresh revelation of SEASONS IN MINISTRY.
- I want you to take a piece of paper and make 5 lines and number them.
- On line one, I want you to write MY NOW SEASON.
- On the last line I want you to write MY NEXTZ SEASON.
- I want to SHARE what the Lord revealed to me as it relates from GOING FROM MY "NOW" SEASON to my "NEXT" SEASON.

Ecclesiastes 3:1 - "To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under heaven."

- God works in seasons.
Nature reveals it.
Scripture confirms it.
Your life proves it.

If we misinterpret our season, we mismanage our assignment.

- I want to talk about five spiritual seasons every believer walks through:
- Your **NOW Season**
- Your **DO Season**
- Your **DEW Season**
- Your **DUE Season**
- Your **NEXT Season**

1. YOUR NOW SEASON

This is the season of awareness.

- Your “Now Season” is where you currently stand — whether you like it or not.

It may be:

- *A season of growth*
- *A season of waiting*
- *A season of stretching*
- *A season of pruning*
- *A season of rebuilding*
- Before Joshua ever crossed into promise, he had to first recognize his moment.

In Joshua 1:2, God says: “Moses my servant is dead. NOW then...”

- God didn’t let Joshua live in yesterday. He called him into **NOW**.

What you do in your NOW determines what you walk into NEXT.

- Your NOW season is not random. It is intentional preparation.

2. YOUR DO SEASON

This is the season of obedience.

Look at this verse again – “Let us not grow weary in WELL DOING”
Galatians 6:9

- The DO season is when God gives instruction.
- It's when faith must become movement.
- Many people love revelation. Few embrace responsibility.

Joshua had to step into the Jordan.
No step — no miracle.

The DO season requires:

- *Courage*
- *Faith*
- *Initiative*
- *Obedience before evidence*

- Do season is MY PART

You can't harvest what you won't plant.

3. YOUR DEW SEASON

This is the hidden, refreshing season.

Dew falls quietly.

No thunder.
No spotlight.
No applause.

Yet dew sustains growth.

In **Hosea 14:5**, God says:
"I will be like the dew to Israel."

The Dew Season is:

- *Private prayer.*
- *Hidden faithfulness.*
- *Character formation.*
- *Quiet consistency.*

It's where:

- **Due season is where God builds roots before fruit.**
- Depth develops before visibility.
- Don't despise your dew.
- Some of your greatest growth is happening where nobody sees it.

(ARTICLE) THE SIGNIFICANCE OF DEW

Dew is one of nature's most overlooked miracles. It arrives silently in the night, unnoticed by most, yet its impact on the earth is profound. Long before modern irrigation systems, dew played a vital role in sustaining crops, nourishing soil, and preserving life in dry climates. What appears fragile and insignificant is, in reality, a powerful agent of growth and renewal.

Dew forms when warm air cools and moisture condenses on the earth's surface, usually in the early morning hours. In arid and semi-arid regions, dew can provide a crucial source of water when rainfall is scarce. Even a small amount of moisture can make a meaningful difference to plants and soil.

- *Sustains plant life by hydrating leaves and shallow roots*
 - *Reduces water stress during dry seasons*
- *Supports photosynthesis by keeping leaf surfaces moist*
- *Protects fragile plants from temperature extremes overnight*

Unlike rainstorms that can be heavy and disruptive, dew is gentle. It does not erode soil or damage tender growth. It simply settles, soaking in quietly and steadily. Dew works best in stillness—when the night is calm and the earth is at rest.

*Scripture frequently uses dew as a metaphor for God’s provision, blessing, and presence. The Bible speaks of the **dew of heaven** as something sacred—life-giving, refreshing, and divinely appointed.*

*In **Genesis 27:28**, blessing is described as “the dew of heaven,” symbolizing favor and abundance. **Hosea 14:5** records God’s promise: “I will be like the dew to Israel; he shall blossom like the lily.” Dew, in Scripture, is never loud or dramatic—it is subtle, consistent, and transformational.*

*The **dew of heaven** represents:*

God’s quiet work in our lives

Spiritual nourishment that comes in seasons of stillness

Daily grace that sustains us when answers seem delayed

Renewal that happens while we rest, not strive

Just as natural dew falls at night, spiritual dew often comes in seasons when we feel unseen, waiting, or uncertain. God is at work when we are still.

*Rain may symbolize breakthroughs and visible miracles, but dew represents **process**. Dew reminds us that not all growth comes from dramatic moments—much of it happens in silence.*

*Spiritual growth does not always come through powerful events or immediate answers to prayer. Often, it comes through the **daily dew** of God’s presence—moments of quiet prayer, Scripture, waiting, and trust.*

The dew of heaven:

***Softens hardened places** in our hearts*

Sustains faith during dry or confusing seasons

Prepares us for fruitfulness before harvest ever comes

Teaches patience, reminding us that growth takes time

*When we rush seasons or demand rain when God is sending dew, we may miss what He is doing beneath the surface. Dew teaches us that God often grows us **before** He promotes us.*

Dew never announces itself, yet the earth depends on it. In the same way, God's quiet work in our lives is often the most transformative. The dew of heaven may not feel like much in the moment, but over time, it produces strength, resilience, and fruit.

If you find yourself in a season where nothing seems to be happening, take heart. The dew is falling. God is at work—silently, faithfully, and purposefully—preparing you for the day ahead and the season to come.

4. YOUR DUE SEASON

This is the appointed time of harvest.

In **Galatians 6:9**: "In due season we shall reap, if we faint not."

Notice: It's not just season — it's **due season**.

Due means:

- *Appointed*
- *Timed*
- *Scheduled by God*
- You don't force due season.
You endure toward it.

Due season comes:

- *After obedience*
- *After sowing*
- *After pruning*
- *After perseverance*

And when it comes:

- *Doors open.*
- *Favor increases.*
- *Provision flows.*
- *Influence expands.*
- *Breakthrough happens.*

But here's the warning — Don't quit in dew and miss your due.

5. YOUR NEXT SEASON

This is the transition into greater assignment.

- Every due season eventually becomes someone's new NOW season.
- When Israel crossed the Jordan, it wasn't the end — it was the beginning of battles, territory, and expansion.

Your NEXT season may require:

- Greater faith
- Greater responsibility
- Greater maturity
- Greater surrender

In **Isaiah 43:19**, God says: "Behold, I will do a new thing..."

But here's the key: You can't step into NEXT if you're clinging to what was.

New wine requires new wineskins

If you're in:

- **NOW** — Pay attention.
- **DO** — Obey.
- **DEW** — Stay faithful.
- **DUE** — Stay humble.
- **NEXT** — Stay surrendered.

The same God who led you into NOW season will lead you into your NEXT season.

- And if you will trust Him through every phase...
- You will discover:

Every season has purpose.
Every season has provision.
Every season has promise.

- Stay faithful in your season.
Your harvest is coming.
