Sermon Text: Luke 22:1–23

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Sermon Title: Our Passover Lamb

Main Idea: The Lord's Supper assures us that our Lord controls the past, present, and future.

Breaking the Ice

- What have you found most beneficial in preparing yourself for the Lord's Supper?

Excavating the Truth

- Reread Luke 22:1–23
- What do we know about Judas from verses 3, 4, 6, and 23, and what are some things that are left unknown?
- In verse 22, what is the significance of the phrase “it has been determined” and the contrasting “but woe to that man”?

Applying the Truth Personally

- How can I more highly value the Lord giving His body and blood for me?
- The disciples all recognized that they *could* betray the Lord in verse 23. What do I need to do to ensure that I do not betray my Lord?

Applying the Truth Congregationally

- How can we help each other remember the significance of the Lord's Supper more each month as we celebrate it together?
- How can we help one another anticipate the day when our Lord *will* "drink of the fruit of the vine" (v. 18) again?

Digging Deeper

- Think through the Passover event in Exodus 12 and describe how it prefigures the deliverance that Christ alludes to in Luke 22:16.

- Compare Matthew 26:14–35 and Mark 14:10–26 with Luke 22:1–23. How does moving the warning of the coming betrayal to after the institution of the Lord’s Supper show Luke’s emphasis?
