



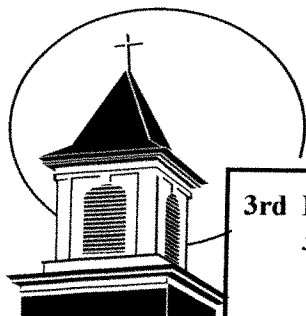

Music Ministry at Faith GMC

The music department thanks everyone who performed special music during the 2026 Easter season. The choir will continue to practice every Wednesday at 7:00 pm through the month of May and will share anthems during the second service until June 14th.

We are asking children, youth, and adults to consider sharing their musical talents this summer. A sign-up sheet is on the choir door. You can perform your music during the first, second, or both services.

There is interest in a *summer choir* that would sing occasionally during the summer. This *summer choir* would practice Sunday mornings at 9:30 a.m. There will be sign-up sheet for anyone who is interested in this opportunity. As it is nearing May, the Hanover family must make an important decision about our future. We have delayed making this decision since coming to Pennsylvania. It is a weighty decision, and one that represents letting go of one of our final connections back to Ohio. We must pick a new local comic book shop. Furthermore, we have to choose one before Free Comic Book Day on May 2.

Okay, I understand that to most people, this seems like a very insignificant part of life. Yet it has more meaning for us. We first visited our previous store, Alter Ego Comics, on Free Comic Book Day in 2019. When businesses shut down in 2020, the store started a Facebook live sale of new comics and old stock. Wesley was just learning how to read, and comics were his main motivation. It became a weekly ritual for our family to sit down and watch the Facebook show and read comic books together. Over the years, the owners and employees grew to know our family and our interests. Often, when we would come in to pick up our comics, they would highlight something new for our family, and more than once gave us a “special” deal on something they were ready to move off the sales floor. For us, it’s not just a decision about where to visit for Free Comic Book Day; it is acknowledging that something special in our family is gone, and moving on.

There’s been greater emphasis the last few years about looking at the church as a competing service provider. We provide religious services, in competition with every other place that could provide comfort, therapy, or other religious services. This approach acknowledges that we have no lack of choices, in terms of churches, or even things to do on a Sunday morning. By this model, we evaluate churches based on quality of music, availability of children’s programming, quality of sermon, etc.

What this misses is that a church is so much more. Yes, we exist to make new disciples of Jesus and to worship God with all that we do. That is not just providing services. It is developing relationships. It is not just the sermon and the music. It is the person that sits next to you that encourages your faith. It is the person you serve next to at the Fish Fry or the Food Bank’s Grab & Go. It is the Sunday School that prays for you during a rough season.

Just as our comic book store was way more than a provider of books, a church is way more than a provider of religious services.

I want to challenge you this spring to do two things:

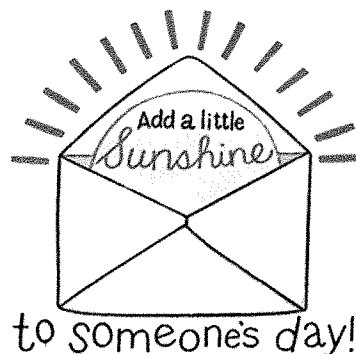
First, I want you to reach out and encourage someone in the church. Ask a Sunday School child what they learned in class today. Say “thank you” to someone who read scripture or led the children’s message. Ask the person sitting next to you how you can pray for them this week.

Second, reach out to someone who isn’t able to be a regular part of our worship. Reach out to a shut-in who is unable to come every week, or a member battling with illness. Remind them that even if they aren’t here Sunday morning, they are still an important part of our family.

We’re more than just a gathering on Sunday morning. We are a preview of what the fellowship of all believers will be in the Kingdom that is to come.

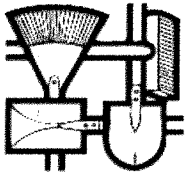

Adult Sunday School **BEACONS OF FAITH** *Submitted by Barb Hilty*

The Beacons of Faith adult Sunday school class started a new course on April 26, 2026, entitled *The Great 50 Days*. The Great 50 Days, also known as Eastertide in the Christian liturgical calendar, is the span of time between Christ's resurrection and the giving of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. *Pentecost* is the Greek word for *fifty*. While Pentecost falls on May 24th this year, our 6 weeks of lessons will take us through May 31, 2026, the final Sunday in the regular Sunday School schedule.

Our curriculum is a companion piece to the brand new worship resource, *The Great 50 Days*, which is co-authored by Tesia Mallory and Jonathan Hanover. The Beacon Class participants will be exploring topics such as "Expectation" and "Hope" through the events recorded in the Scriptures. We'll discuss the biblical stories of those 50 days and consider how Christ's resurrection impacts the way we live our lives and its bearing in the manner we worship God and interact with others.

All folks are welcome to be a part of the Beacon Class's time of prayer, fellowship, discussion, and laughter. We meet each Sunday at 9 AM in the Moses Room, which is the third room on the right on the first floor of the education wing (back from the social hall). There's a seat waiting for you!

The Great 50 Days

- I grew up in church, but never paid much attention to the Christian calendar. As a pastor, at first I only paid attention to the big seasons of Lent and Advent. One of my best friends from seminary is involved at the highest levels of the Global Methodist Church in forming our worship practices. Through her influence, I have begun to see the importance of the church calendar. It creates rhythms and patterns that influence us. Just as our family is influenced by the school calendar, the government calendar, and the Everton football season schedule, the Christian calendar teaches patterns that influence faith.
- We are currently in a season called *The Great 50 Days*. It is the season between Easter and Pentecost. It represents the time when Jesus was risen, but before the church was given its direction from the Holy Spirit. I love this season. For me, this season is much closer to real life. Easter is fantastic. It is the mountain-top experience. The Great 50 Days is the “now what?” It is the time we figure out what it means to live in the resurrection.
- We are celebrating with a special sermon series during this time, leading up to Pentecost on May 24. Faith GMC is my test case; this series will likely be published in 2027. After Pentecost, we begin a series on the Apostles’ Creed, with a very loose Star Wars theme, *This is the Way*. Keep an eye out for that!

Mission Opportunity—Support Croatia!

Last summer, we were blessed to host Vatroslav Župančić, the pastor of the only Global Methodist Church in Croatia. Vatroslav and his church in Zagreb are mission partners of our conference. Eastern Europe is a difficult place to pastor, and Vatroslav faces additional challenges, as his church is the only Global Methodist Church in Croatia. His conference is located in Slovakia, which is separated from Croatia by Hungary. He really is off by himself, trying to build a Methodist connection. Our church made the decision to support his church & ministry!

Our missions team is encouraging our church to set a goal of raising **\$2,500 per year** over the next three years to help the Zagreb church become self-sustainable and expand in Croatia. This goal is for second-mile giving, meaning it is not from our church budget. Rather, we encourage people to consider a special gift towards this mission. **As of 4/12/26, \$2,815 has been collected.** I continue to encourage you to prayerfully consider if God is calling you to support Vatroslav and our Croatian brothers and sisters in Christ!

**On Monday, May 18, 2026, Faith Church will be participating in
Grab & Go Operation Fresh Express.**

Grab & Go is a supplemental program to the existing Westmoreland Food Bank pantry program. Our church is a “sponsor” for the program. As a sponsor, we are responsible for providing the volunteers to direct traffic, place boxes of food in the clients’ cars, and monitor inside the church building by the restrooms. Grab & Go takes place in our church parking lot, rain or shine. So you need to dress for the weather.

Parking attendants and the church monitor should arrive by 2 p.m. All other volunteers should arrive by 3 p.m. and park in the grass on the left of Dollman Way, with overflow parking in the grass by the back porch and fire pit. Distribution may start earlier than 4:00 p.m. depending on the size of the crowd and when the Westmoreland Food Bank trucks arrive, but we always stay until at least 5:00 p.m.

A sign up sheet is on the Action Table in the Gathering Area for those who would like to participate and to assure that we have enough help.
We need 25 volunteers.



Help Faith GMC Support Our Neighbors

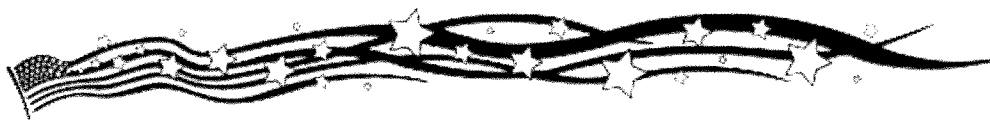

A letter from our Conference Superintendent, Jeff Greenway.

March 25, 2026

A Call to Give Generously

Greetings, Friends, in the name of Jesus!

We are once again asking our churches, clergy, and lay members to participate in a **Miracle Offering** during annual conference.

Our Conference Council has recently agreed to enter a mission partnership with the West Congo Conference—a body that spans 25 of the Democratic Republic of the Congo's 26 provinces, with its headquarter in Kinshasa. We are partnering in this effort with the North Carolina Conference. The West Congo Conference is doing the same thing we did three years ago—starting a new annual conference—but they are doing it in a world where the average wage is \$1 a day. They need our help.

The West Congo Conference has 192 congregations and 48 prayer places where they intend to plant churches—yet they own just one building. Their congregations are served by 18 ordained elders, 4 ordained deacons, and 218 lay preachers.

Our conference budget includes \$50,000 designated to provide five years of transitional support—covering the salaries of the Conference Superintendent, Conference Secretary and other staff, as well as the Presiding Elders, the Conference office in Kinshasa, and the costs for their annual conference gathering.

Our **Miracle Offering** for 2026 will go toward meeting some immediate needs through the Allegheny West/Democratic Republic of Congo Conference Mission Partnership. Rev. Henriette Okolo, the Conference Superintendent, and her leadership team have identified the following pressing needs:

- ◆ **Clean Water—\$50,000:** 1,000 water filters at \$50 each, providing clean drinking water for families or small rural communities. Lack of clean water is the leading cause of health challenges in the DRC.
- ◆ **Motorcycles—\$13,500:** 10 motorcycles at \$1,350 each, enabling the ten Presiding Elders to travel their circuits.
- ◆ **Transportation—\$35,000:** One used SUV to give Conference Superintendent Rev. Okolo dependable transportation as she travels across the conference. Those who are familiar with the DCR say that this is an absolute necessity.
- ◆ **Education—\$19,950:** The West Congo Conference is currently supporting 4 doctoral students (\$1,200/student/year for two years), 1 master's student (\$450/year for two years), and 7 bachelor's students (\$450/student/year for three years). A total of \$19,950 will see all 12 students through to completion and fund the faculty needed to train the conference's 218 lay pastors.
- ◆ **Micro-Business Loans—\$10,000:** A revolving loan fund providing grants of up to \$500 to help start businesses that will sustain local churches and pastors.
- ◆ **Partnership Escrow—\$30,000:** A bridge fund to help meet needs while we build direct connections between circuits in Allegheny West and West Congo.

Our Miracle Offering Goal is \$160,000. I believe this is easily attainable. I've already been informed by three small churches that they raised enough to pay for a motorcycle each. Another church designated 100% of their Easter offering for the Miracle Offering of 2026. I also know of an additional small group that's decided to provide at least \$450 to help pay for a pastor's education. Amazing!

I encourage you to give your congregation the opportunity to give above and beyond your normal giving toward this offering.

Please bring your offering with you to Mt. Vernon. It will be collected during the Global Mission Partnership Worship Celebration on Thursday, June 25, 2026 at Annual Conference.

Simple snacks and refreshments will be available in the social hall during the two 15-minute breaks.

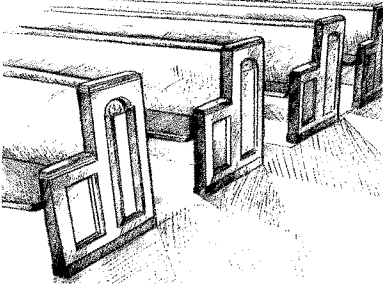

Among the Brambles—

I'm a gardener at heart. Raised outside a small town (at that time) on a rural lane which was sparsely populated (at that time) mostly by relatives, I spent most of my growing up years out-of-doors. Time was spent doing age-appropriate chores to help with my grandparents' truck patch, and I carried over the appreciation for seed planting, weeding, and picking things into my adult life. There's always been a garden of some sort at my home.

Gardening keeps a person active and healthy. Being a control freak, or to borrow Jonathan's phrase, "control enthusiast," I'd always done my best to keep the flower and veggie beds neat, tidy, watered, mulched, dead-headed, and free of weeds (at that time). But now? Not so much. When physical limitations started a few years back, tending gardens took a back seat. God love him, Dave steps up to fill in the blatant gaps of my neglect as best he can, but he's the first to admit he's no poster child for Miracle-Gro commercials.

Sooo... as a result of my lack of diligence, there have been a lot of unwelcome plants encroaching into spaces in the larger flower beds that were planted 30 years ago. Patches of volunteer black raspberries (it only takes one established cane...) have started taking over some sections of the perennial bed. Instead of removing them as they appeared, I justified letting them grow for a few seasons because, well, we do enjoy berry pies. However, it's getting to the point that the unsightly thorny canes are becoming invasive to the established cultivated flowers. What was (at that time) an innocent desire for some sweet rewards has instead produced a chaotic situation in an established place meant for beauty. What else would I expect? Berries do NOT belong in a flower garden.

This spring I was distressed to see that the tangled growth was spreading way too close to the stand of emerging peony shoots. Not good. I let things go too long. Now major effort will be needed to keep things at bay. *But what was that?* There in the midst of the jaggars that had been growing unchecked, I saw a bright yellow spot. A daffodil was bravely blooming, though surrounded by thorns!

*Oh, dear Lord, I'm convicted. When I'm negligent in staying close to You, I don't readily recognize the unwelcome intruders that threaten Your purpose for my life. Can I be as courageous as that daffodil? Can I boldly do precisely what you've created me to be so that I am **Sharing Christ's Love Through Faith** in the middle of the brambles that are moving into the spot you've planted me? It's not in my strength, I know, but through Yours, Mighty God, that I may break free from the encroaching briars of disobedience, from entanglement of wrong choices, and from the ugliness they bring to my life.*

A wise gardener who is diligent in gardening practices will keep invasive berries out of the peonies. But should unforeseeable set-backs occur, beautiful flowers will still bloom among the brambles where their enduring bulbs were first planted. May the grace of God's Holy Spirit always keep me nurtured and strong to do likewise.

Think about it—laundry can't be rushed. We can set the washer for a small load, which does take less time, but it still needs to cycle through all the stages to clean the small load of clothes. Yet these are the situations that force us to rely on Jesus, to lean hard on His grace and compassion, and to trust Him with unanswered questions. All the things that help us grow in our faith take time.

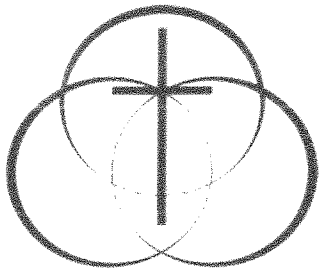
