Joe Lewis, Staff-Parish Relations Committee Chairperson, announced last Sunday that the projected appointments for St. John's clergy are as follows: Rev. Dr. Tim McClendon and Rev. Butch Blackwell will be reappointed, effective June 28, and both are excited about their continued ministry at St. John's. Rev. Douglas Herlong will be appointed to a church in the Atlanta area of the North Georgia Conference due to his upcoming wedding on May 13 to Rev. Maddie Henderson, Associate Chaplain at Emory University. He will be with us until June 28, and we wish Maddie and him all the best. Further information about a well-deserved love gift for Rev. Douglas will be forthcoming. He has been a great asset to the ministries and life of St. John's.

Projected New Associate Pastor

Rev. Will Altman will be our new Associate for Missions, Evangelism and Young Adult Ministries, effective June 28. Rev. Will, age 32, is a 2012 graduate of Clemson University with a B.S. in Animal and Veterinary Science (his father is a veterinarian), and is a native of Galivants Ferry, SC. He received his Master's of Divinity degree in 2020 from Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary. While at Clemson, Rev. Will was Youth Pastor at Lawrence Chapel UMC and Assistant Campus Minister at the Clemson Wesley Foundation. While in Seminary he was appointed to Beulah and Oak Grove UMCs on the Upper Richland Charge. He is presently pastor of the county-seat church of Trinity UMC, Darlington, SC where he has been active in missions, evangelism and young adult ministries. For instance, he expanded the outreach of the church significantly by being the Darlington High School coach for boys soccer and girls tennis. He is marrying Stockton Brown of Garysburg, NC, on May 27. Stockton is a lawyer who has clerked for Federal Judges and for the last 2 years, has been on the mission field with the International Justice Mission in Ghana, Africa. God bless them both.


