Witnessing to others must come from a place of love. People don't care how much you know, until they know how much you care. We share our faith to tell others what we've seen and know to be true in our own lives, so others can experience the same joy we have through Jesus.

What are effective ways to share our testimony with others?

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
ASK GOD TO PREPARE YOUR HEART

SCRIPTURE:

📖 Psalm 51:10-12

DEVOTIONAL THOUGHT:

Asking God to purify our hearts and prepare us to share with others is step one. It allows us to surrender all of ourselves and let the Holy Spirit work through us.



REFLECTION QUESTION:

What does it mean to ask God to create a “pure heart” in you?

SEEING PEOPLE HOW JESUS SEES THEM



SCRIPTURE:

📖 Matthew 9:36-38

DEVOTIONAL THOUGHT:

When it comes to witnessing to those around us, we must have the same compassion that Jesus did for them. Our love for others grows as we pursue Christlikeness.

REFLECTION QUESTION:

What needs to shift for me to see people like Jesus did?

REFLECTION QUESTION:

If someone asked you to share the gospel in one minute, what would you say?

SALVATION THROUGH GRACE, NOT WORKS

SCRIPTURE:

📖 Ephesians 2:8-9

DEVOTIONAL THOUGHT:

Salvation is offered to us through what Jesus has done on the cross on our behalf. Not through anything that we can do on our own. This is an important piece to communicate to others when we are sharing the Gospel.



REFLECTION QUESTION:

How does understanding grace change the way you share your faith?

YOUR STORY HAS POWER



SCRIPTURE:

 Mark 5:19

DEVOTIONAL THOUGHT:

Personal life change can be one of the most powerful things for someone else to hear. It helps bring the Gospel to life. It shows others how Christ has worked in you and that there is a real and tangible love that God has for us. Because of this we should share this love with others.

REFLECTION QUESTION:

Can you articulate who you were before Christ, how you met Him, and how you're different after?

What practical steps can you take to grow in your readiness to share the Gospel?

What fears keep most people from sharing their testimony?

OVERCOMING FEAR OF REJECTION

SCRIPTURE:

☞ Galatians 1:10

DEVOTIONAL THOUGHT:

Sharing your faith with others can be tough for some of us. The idea of fear and rejection can start to creep in. But Galatians 1:10 serves as a reminder that at the end of the day the only approval that matters is God's. This passage is a good heart check with asking the question of "who are we trying to please?"

REFLECTION QUESTION:

When I hesitate to share my faith, what am I most afraid of losing (approval, comfort, reputation, relationship)?

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
YOU AREN'T ALONE WHEN SHARING YOUR FAITH

SCRIPTURE:

📖 Acts 4:31

DEVOTIONAL THOUGHT:

We must remember that when it comes to sharing the Gospel we aren't alone. Boldness comes from the Holy Spirit.



REFLECTION QUESTION:

Do I rely more on my personality or on the Holy Spirit when sharing my faith?

YOU ARE NOT THE SAVIOR



SCRIPTURE:

📖 1 Corinthians 3:6-7

DEVOTIONAL THOUGHT:

We see in this passage that there is a recognition that the pressure of people receiving the Gospel is not on us. Our job is to be the messenger and trust that only God can transform the heart.

REFLECTION QUESTION:

Am I carrying any responsibility that belongs to God?

GROUP QUESTIONS



Read Galatians 1:10. What contrast does Paul make between pleasing people and pleasing God?

Why is it freeing to know that God is responsible for growth?

Read Acts 4:31. What happened immediately after they prayed?

What does faithfulness look like if results are not immediate?



Do you rely more on your natural ability or the Holy Spirit when sharing?

Read 1 Corinthians 3:6-7. What roles are described in this passage?

Why is gentleness important when someone disagrees?

How often do you intentionally pray for people you want to reach out to?

Read 2 Corinthians 4:1-6. How should recognizing spiritual blindness shape the way we pray and respond to people who disagree with us?

SCRIPTURE:

📖 Matthew 5:13-16

DEVOTIONAL THOUGHT:

How we live our lives should reflect worship to our Creator. And it should be evident and obvious just like a light on a hill is. Verse 16 really illustrates this point. Take some time to re-read this verse.

REFLECTION QUESTION:

What do I need to do to make my “light” more visible?

WORSHIP THAT IS GRATEFUL

SCRIPTURE:

📖 Colossians 3:15-17

DEVOTIONAL THOUGHT:

We are to let all that we do, be done in the name of the Lord. When we keep this as our focus, it can help encourage and spur one another on towards good deeds.




REFLECTION QUESTION:

INTEGRITY IN OUR LIVES



SCRIPTURE:

📖 1 Peter 2:12

DEVOTIONAL THOUGHT:

Our lives are meant to look different than those that are of this world. We are called to be set apart. Not for the purpose of being “holier than thou”, but so that others can see how our lives glorify God.

REFLECTION QUESTION:

What do I need to surrender to better live out this passage?

GROUP QUESTIONS



What does Jesus mean when He calls believers “the salt of the earth” and “the light of the world”?

Read Matthew 5:16. What is the ultimate purpose of letting our light shine?

How does visible faith strengthen our witness when sharing the Gospel?

Read Colossians 3:15. What does Paul say should rule our hearts? How does a sense of peace help us share our faith with others.



What do you need to surrender to better reflect Christ?

What practical habit can you start to prioritize daily worship?

Read Psalm 63:1-5. How would you describe David's desire for God in this passage?

How can gratitude make our faith more attractive to others?

What specific steps can you take to make your "light" more visible this week?

After Psalm 63:1-5, what does this passage teach about making worship a daily priority rather than a weekly event? Why is this important for witnessing?
