Homework: The Personal Inventory

Elevation requires increased capacity.
Increased capacity requires a deep dive into your personal inventory.

God rarely elevates what He has not first examined. Before He entrusts you with more, He walks you through what you already carry. This week, take an honest inventory across three areas. Don't rush the questions — sit with them. What surfaces here is what God is speaking to you about your life right now.

INTERNAL METRICS

Who Are You Becoming?

Before God elevates your platform or position, He examines your person. Every promotion passes through character before it reaches position. Internal metrics measure what no one applauds — the thoughts you entertain when no one's watching, the disciplines you keep when no one's counting, the wounds you've let heal instead of harden. You cannot carry tomorrow's assignment with today's unrefined character. Elevation doesn't create who you are — **it exposes it.**

Reflect: *What is God currently reshaping in you that you've been resisting?*

FUNCTIONAL METRICS

What Are You Producing?

Growth that never produces is just motion without movement. Functional metrics ask a sobering question: has your internal work actually yielded fruit? Elevation is not a reward for potential — it's a response to productivity. God isn't only watching who you're becoming in private; He's watching what that becoming is producing in public. Your gifts may affirm you, but your fruit is what qualifies you.

Reflect: *What is your growth actually producing — and would someone else notice it without you pointing it out?*

IMPACT METRICS

Who Are You Influencing?

Elevation was never meant to end with you. Impact metrics measure the ripple, not just the rock. Who is better because you said yes to your process? Who is learning from your example, leaning on your wisdom, healing because you healed first? If your growth hasn't increased your capacity to pour into someone else, it has only increased your comfort — not your calling.

Reflect: *Name one person your growth this season should be reaching. Are you reaching them?*

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Take your inventory this week. Elevation is waiting on your capacity — and your capacity is waiting on you.
