

Blind to God's Love

This 5-day devotional guide is based on Proverbs 30:1-4 and will help you prepare your heart for the upcoming Sunday sermon, "Knowing What You Don't Know," in the preaching series, "Wisdom in Plain Sight." It may also be used as a guide for family devotions and is for the week ending Saturday, June 27, 2026.

Monday

Scripture: Proverbs 30:1

Questions for Reflection

- Who is speaking in this verse, and how is he identified?
- What does the tone of this introduction suggest about Agur's approach to wisdom?
- How comfortable are you with admitting limitations in your understanding of life and God?
- In what area of your life do you most need to approach God as a learner rather than an expert?

Questions for Children

- Who is talking in this verse?
- Is this person proud of himself, or does he seem humble?

Prayer Prompt

Lord, teach me to approach Your wisdom with humility. Help me to be

eager to learn rather than quick to assume I already know.

Tuesday

Scripture: Proverbs 30:2

Questions for Reflection

- How does Agur describe himself in relation to wisdom and understanding?
- What does this verse reveal about the limits of human knowledge?
- Why is it sometimes difficult to admit spiritual or intellectual weakness?
- How might acknowledging your limitations open the door to greater dependence on God?

Questions for Children

- What does Agur say about how much he knows?
- Does he think he is very wise, or not very wise?

Prayer Prompt

God, remind me that I do not know everything. Help me rely on You instead of trusting only in myself.

Wednesday

Scripture: Proverbs 30:3

Questions for Reflection

- What does Agur say he has not learned or attained?
- How does this verse connect true wisdom with the knowledge of God?

- How can knowledge about life fall short if it is disconnected from God?
- What steps can you take to grow not just in information, but in knowing God more deeply?

Questions for Children

- What important thing does Agur say he does not have?
- Who does he want to know better?

Prayer Prompt

Lord, help me seek wisdom that leads me closer to You. Teach me to value knowing You more than simply knowing facts.

Thursday

Scripture: Proverbs 30:4

Adult Questions

- What kinds of actions are described in these questions about God's power?
- What do these questions suggest about the difference between God and humanity?
- How does reflecting on God's greatness reshape your view of daily problems?
- In what ways do you need to trust God's power rather than your own abilities?

Questions for Children

- What big things does this verse say God can do?

- Can people do these things, or only God?

Prayer Prompt

Great God, You are far beyond anything I can fully understand. Help me trust Your power and wisdom in every part of my life.

Friday

Scripture: Proverbs 30:4

Questions for Reflection

- What final question does Agur ask about God and His Son?
- How does this question deepen the mystery and majesty of God?
- Why is knowing *who* God is more important than knowing answers to every question?
- How does this verse encourage humility and worship as part of true wisdom?

Questions for Children

- What question does Agur ask at the end of the verse?
- Does this verse help us see that God is very special and different from us?

Prayer Prompt

Holy God, help me grow in awe of who You are. Lead me to worship You with humility and trust as I seek Your wisdom.
