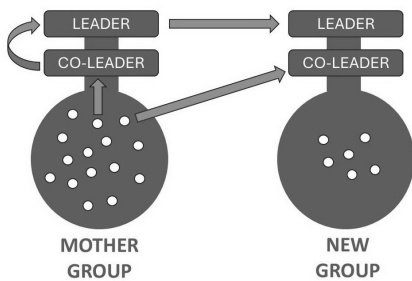


Three Ways to Multiply Your Connection Group

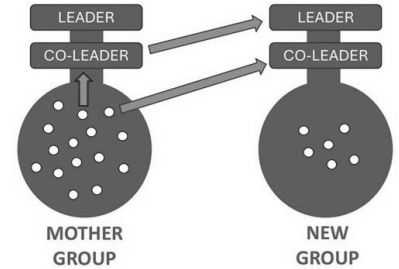
Once you have Co-Leaders in place, there are two ways to go about multiplying your group.



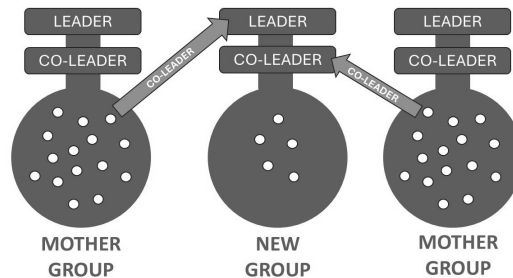
Scenario #1: The Group Leader leaves the existing group, taking a Co-Leader with him to help start a new group. They can start the new group from scratch or take volunteers from the old group.

Another Co-Leader becomes the leader of the old group with another Co-Leader remaining as their Co-Leader. Together, they set about developing disciples and raising up new Co-Leaders.

Scenario #2: The Group Leader stays with the original group and the Co-Leader ventures out with assistance from another Co-Leader to start a new group from scratch or with volunteers from the old group. Another Co-Leader stays with the original group Leader and the original group.



Scenario #3: When two groups that have raised up multiple Co-Leaders, they might send out a Co-Leader from each group to start a new group, with one serving as the Leader for the new group and the other as Co-Leader. They can start the new group from scratch or take volunteers from their old groups.



Note: We wait to have enough Co-Leaders before we multiply because we believe a leader team helps guarantee success when multiplying groups.
