## QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION:

1. Was there something that surprised you about Abram's life from today's message? Why do you think Abraham is considered "the man of faith?"
2. What in this passage do you find most reassuring? Most disturbing? Most shocking? Most comforting?
3. Have you experienced God's call on your life to embrace Christ as Savior and Lord? If so, are you willing to share it with the group?
4. In 12:2-3, God promises to bless Abram so that he will be a blessing to all peoples. How does this shift our

perspective on the personal blessings we receive (finances, talents, time)? Are we viewing them as destinations or as tools for others?

5. In verse 5 it says that Abram went on this journey along with "all of his possessions and the people they had acquired." That phrase, "the people they had acquired" according to scholar, Umberto Cassuto indicates that Abram, through his witnessing had won people to the Lord. How can we, in our culture, find ways to bear witness to the Lordship of Christ in our lives?
