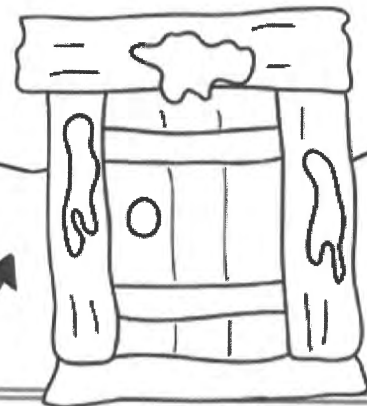


# Feast of Unleavened Bread

When the Israelites left Egypt, they were in such a hurry that they did not have time to let their bread dough rise. They carried the unbaked dough on their backs, and as they were walking, it cooked in the sun. Because the bread had no yeast, it became hard and flat, and was known as 'matzah'. Eating matzah every year during the Feast of Unleavened Bread reminds us of the Israelites' escape from Egypt and how Yah delivered them from slavery.

The Feast of Unleavened Bread begins on the fifteenth day of Nissan (March - April) with the Passover meal, and lasts for seven days. The Passover points to Yeshua as our Passover lamb. Yeshua died on the day of preparation for the Passover at the same hour the lambs were being killed for the Passover meal that evening.

The Hebrew word for unleavened bread is matzah. Matzah is a type of bread made from flour and water. Matzah is eaten during the Feast of Unleavened Bread.

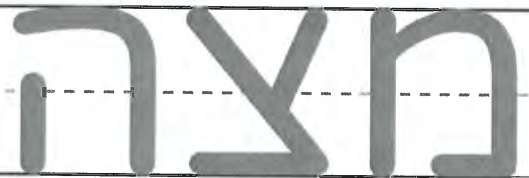
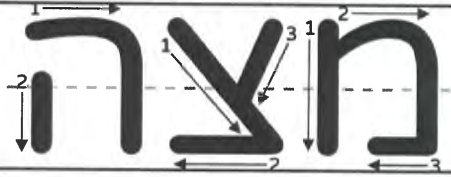

## INGREDIENTS

4 cups of flour

1 cup of salt

Warm water to moisten the dough

Wooden toothpicks

## METHOD

Preheat your oven to 350 F.

Combine the flour and salt in a large bowl.

Add enough water to make the dough sticky.

Mold the clay into three strands of dough.

Braid the dough and form a circle.

Bake in the oven at 350 F for 30 minutes, or until hard and dry.

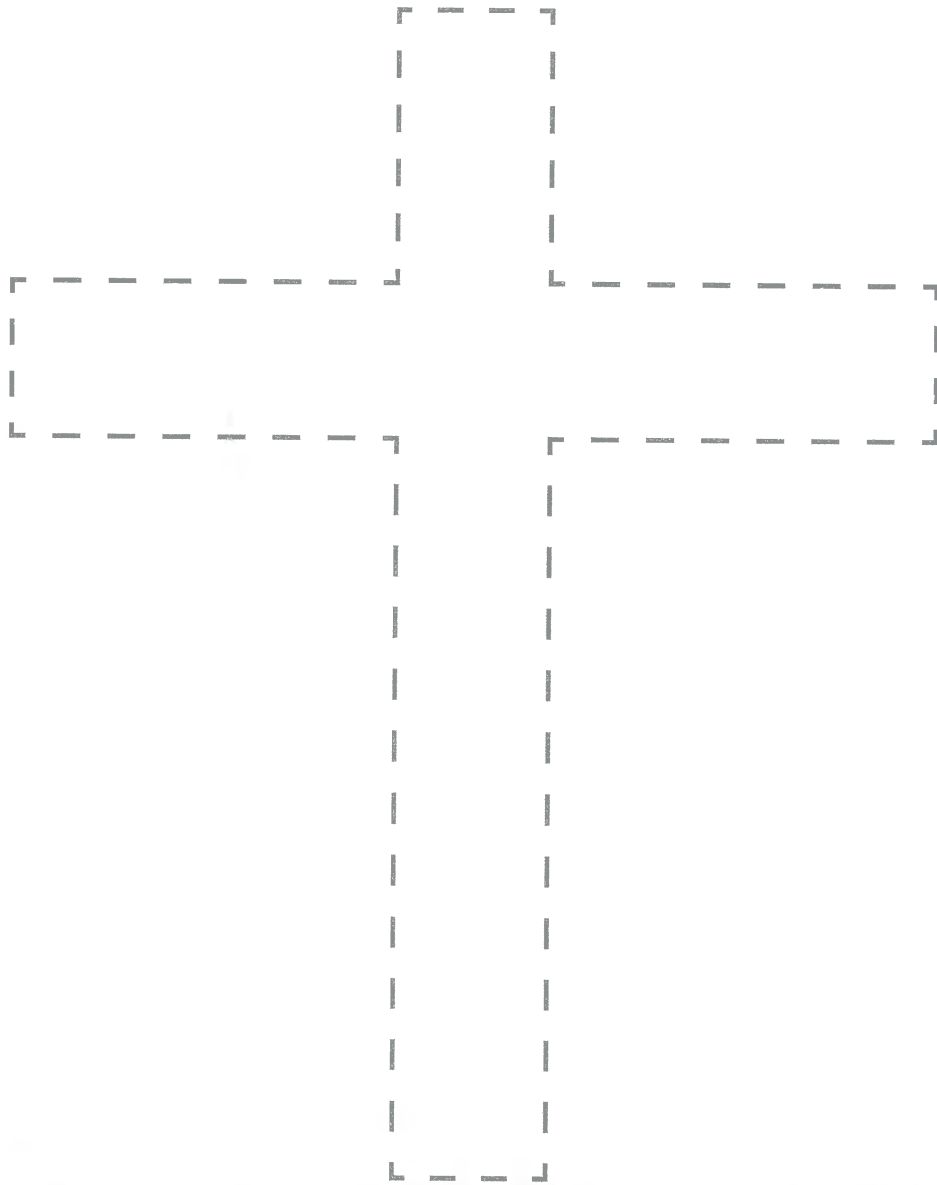
Remove from oven.

When cool, place wooden toothpicks (thorns) in crown.

# Feast of First Fruits

The Feast of Unleavened Bread was a busy time in Jerusalem. Thousands of people came to the city to keep the Feast for seven days. Some slept in Jerusalem, while others stayed in nearby villages or in tents around the city.

During this Feast, there is an Appointed Time called First Fruits. This day falls on the day after the Sabbath during the Feast of Unleavened Bread. In ancient Israel, the High Priest would wave the first sheaf of barley before Yah at the temple on this day.

Did you know that Yeshua rose from the grave on the Feast of First Fruits? This is why Paul the Apostle wrote that He was the 'first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.'

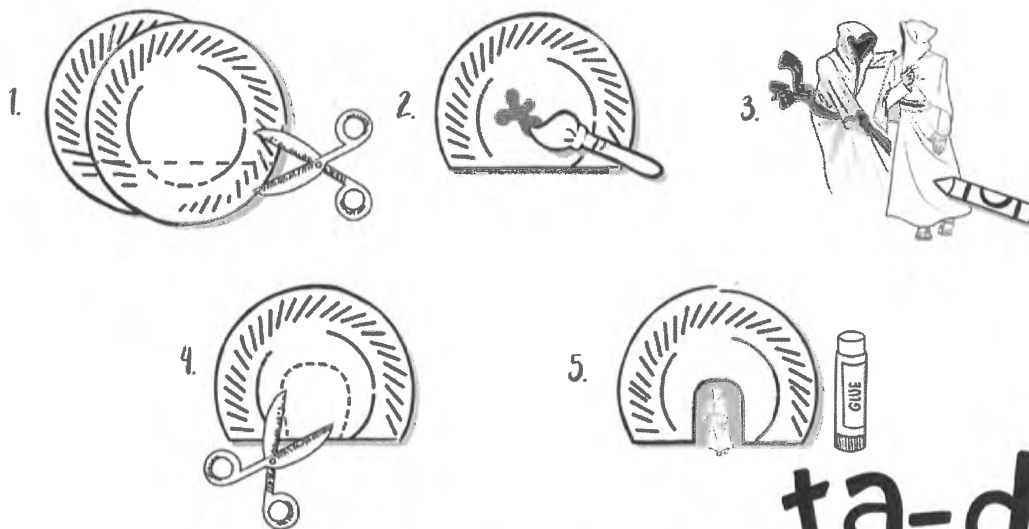
# Resurrection paper plate craft

## You will need:

1. Two thick foam or paper plates
2. Heavy card stock
3. Grey paint or crayons
4. Yeshua and the angel characters
5. Scissors (adult only)
6. Glue sticks or School glue

## Instructions:

1. Cut out the Yeshua and angel templates. Make copies onto heavy card stock.
2. Cut the bottoms off both paper plates so they can stand up. Paint or color the paper plates grey. Remember to color the front and back!
3. While the paper plates are drying, color Yeshua and the angel.
4. Cut out a door on one paper plate. Glue both paper plates together to form a tomb. Glue Yeshua and the angel onto the tomb.



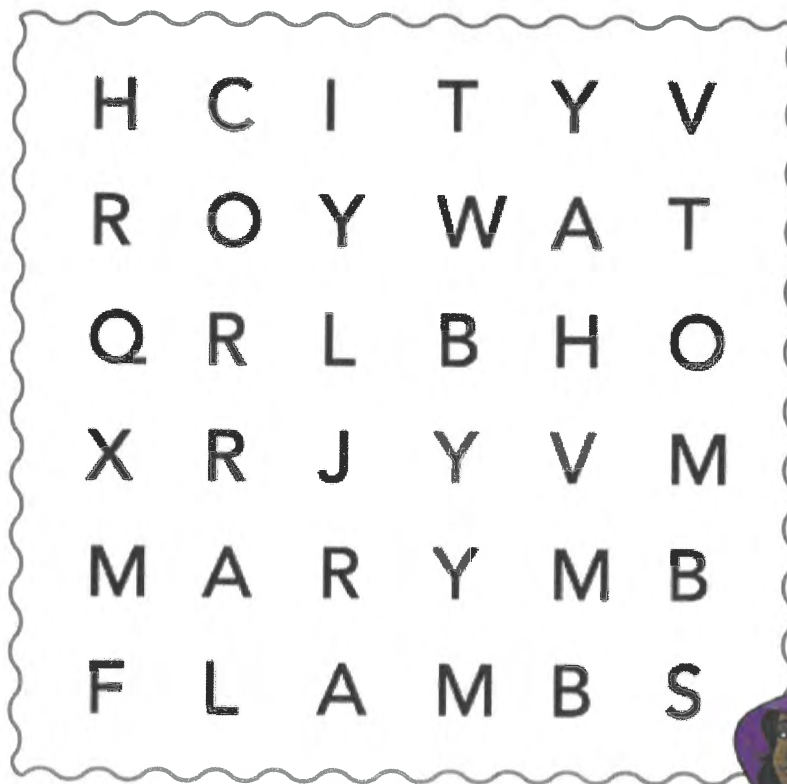

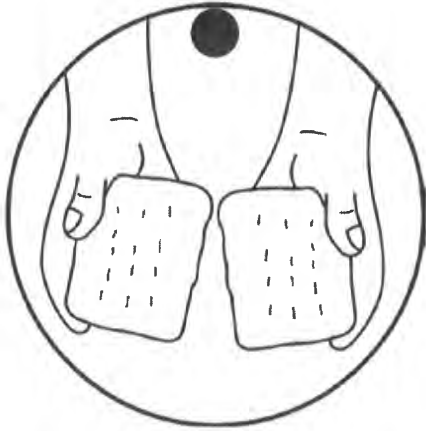
## You will need:

Shavu'ot is also the time when people remember how Yah gave the children of Israel the commandments (Torah) on Mount Sinai.

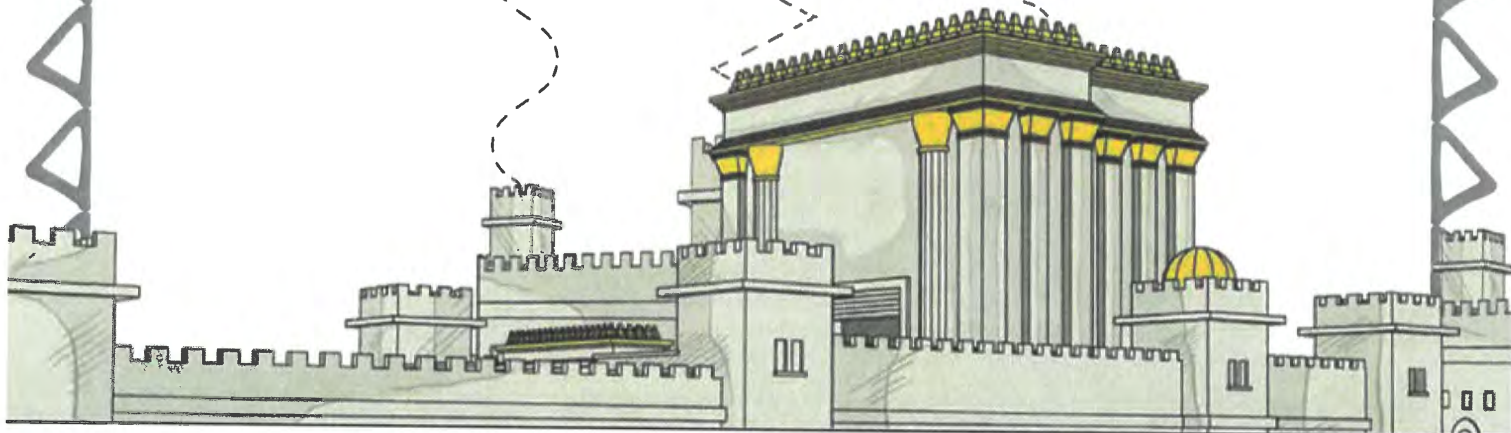
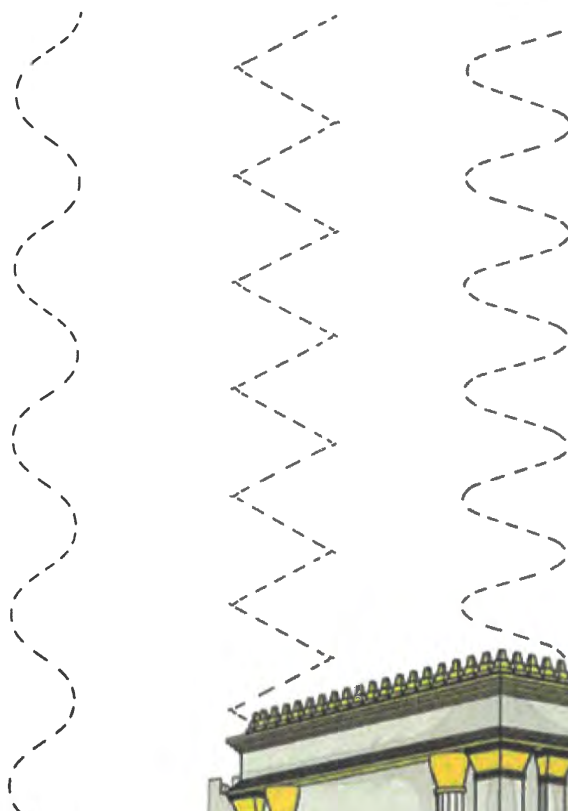

# Help Moses climb Mount Sinai

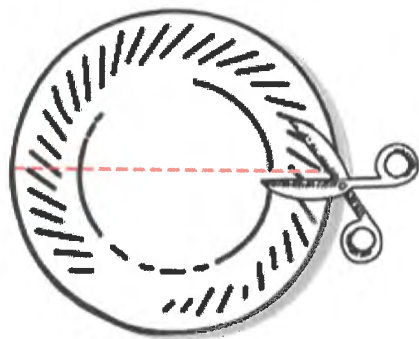
## You will need:

## Instructions:

1. Cut your paper plate in half.
2. Color your mountain grey using paint, markers or crayons. Draw green trees or leaves at the bottom of the plate.
3. Cut out the Moses template. Paste onto heavy card stock.
4. Insert the paper fastener into the bottom center of the paper plate. Push the fastener into the long end of the Moses template and secure. Now Moses can climb up and down Mount Sinai!

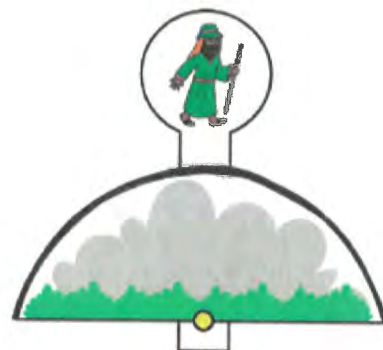

The ancient Israelites wore clothing like tunics and robes. Let's make a tunic! Ask your parents to help you do this.

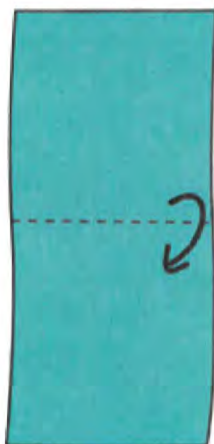
### Instructions:
