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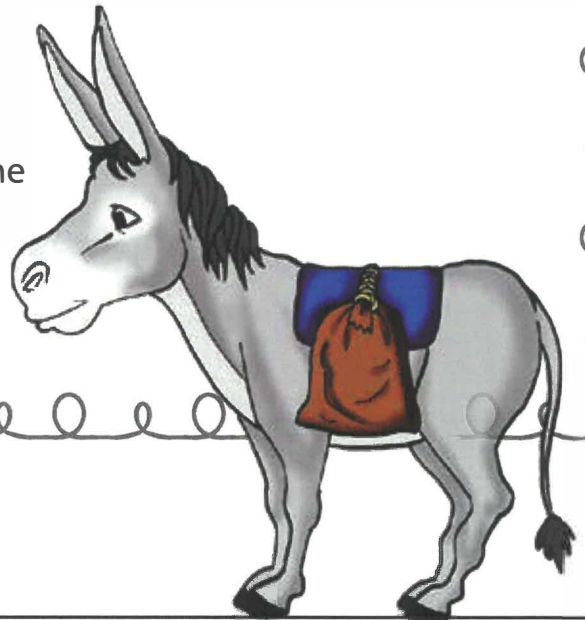
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LET'S DISCUSS: D'VARIM

Open your Bibles and read the Bible verses below.
Discuss these questions with your family, friends, and classmates.

1. Read Deuteronomy 1:1-3:22: In this Torah Portion, Moses is retelling the story of the Israelites journey through the wilderness to young Israelites. Why do you think it took the Israelites forty years to reach the Promised Land?
2. Read Deuteronomy 1:32 and Hebrews 3:19: Why did G-D not allow the older generation of Israelites to enter the Promised Land? How can you apply this lesson to your own life?
3. Read Deuteronomy 2:9-3:11: This Bible passage mentions giants (Nephilim). Do some research. Do you believe giants used to live on the earth?
4. Read James 2:1-9: G-D asks us to show no partiality. What does this mean? How can you apply this instruction to your own life?
5. Read Deuteronomy 1:19-33 and Acts 7:38-43: What mistakes did Israel make in the wilderness? What can you learn from these mistakes?
6. Read Acts 7:38-35: While the Israelites were in the wilderness, they chose to worship other gods instead of G-D, the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. What is spiritual adultery?
