HEBREW LETTER OF THE MONTH OF ADAR

This month's letter of the alef-bet is Tzadi. It is the eighteenth letter of the alef-bet. Say: "Tzah-DEE". This letter makes a fun sound that is spoken in English but not really represented by a single letter. It sounds like the TZ sound in the middle of pizza, or at the end of huts. Many people imagine the letter tzadi looks like a person kneeling in prayer. This is a fun idea because the name of the letter sounds similar to the word 'tzadik', which is the word in Ivrit for a righteous person. The tzadi makes a fun sound, you can make it by placing the front of your tongue against the back of your top teeth and quickly pushing a bit of air out with your belly. Use your finger to trace the tzadi on the next page, and then look at the items that begin with this very cool letter; can you read the names aloud? Run your finger underneath the letters and remember that Hebrew is read from right to left.

Show them the picture. Trace the letter with your finger and say "tzadi" then take their index finger and gently trace over the letter, repeat.


