HEBREW LETTER OF THE MONTH OF ELUL

This month's letter is sin and it is pronounced seen. The way to remember the difference between the shin and sin is to remember if the dot is on the left it is sin. Sin is the 21st letter of the alef-bet, and shares this position with the shin that has a dot on the right. Sin is a letter that makes a sound that is very like our English letter "s". We make this sound by pressing our teeth together in a wide smile and hissing like a snake. Many words in Ivrit begin with sin and Sarah our matriarch who gave birth to Yitzchak in her old age, was originally named Sarai, but G-D changed her name to Sarah, which means princess. It is an understanding within the community that a name is a VERY important thing.. Look at the names of the things that start with the letter sin. We can move our learning forward by tracing the letter sin. Use your finger to trace the large letter sin on the next page, and then look at the items that begin with it; you can read the names aloud and run your finger underneath the letters as you read. Remember. that Hebrew, unlike English, is read from right to left.

Show them the picture. Trace the letter with your finger and say “seen”, then take their index finger, gently trace over the letter, repeat.

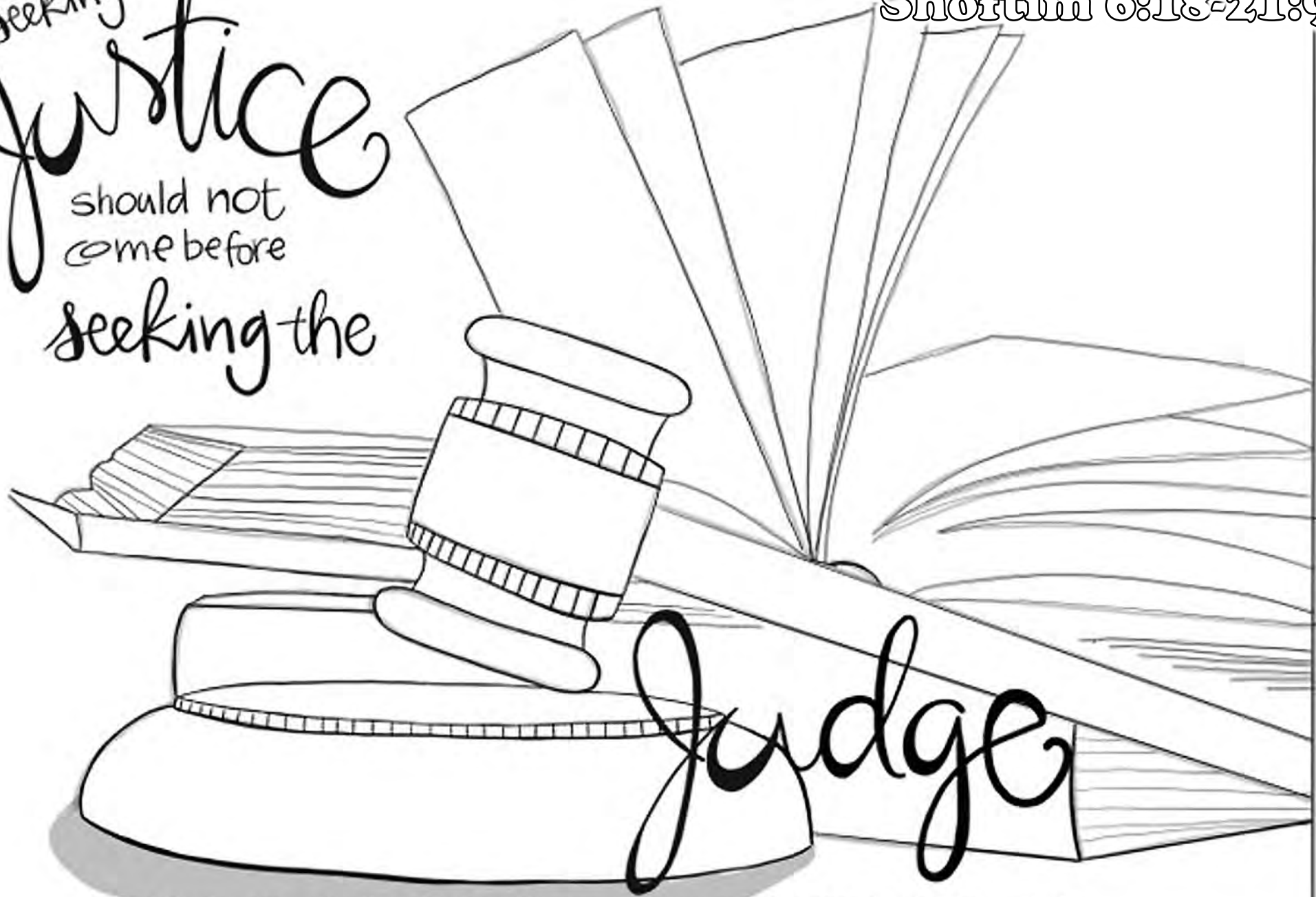
