<p>IDENTITY: FOLLOWER OF G-D'S WORD 5 MINUTES</p>	<p>Ask: Can any hide from the eyes of G-D? If we make the choice to watch something is there a way to un-see it?</p>	<p>Discuss: Are these promises frightening, or hopeful?</p>

<p>IDENTITY: DOER OF G-D'S WORD</p> <p>5 MINUTES</p>	<p>Who we are is largely dependent upon what we do; we separate ourselves with purity, and trust in HIS promises.</p>	<p>Ask: What does "people with tzara'at are being healed" mean to us?</p>
<p>GAME/ACTIVITY</p>	<p>Kedoshim</p>	<p><<-what does it mean to be holy?</p>
<p>HOMEWORK</p> <p>3 MINUTES</p>	<p>Our letter of the month of Iyyar is ayin. Look around shul for something that begins with the sound like the English letter "a, ah, ee, o, or oo"; "Shavua tov, until next week!"</p>	<p>Close with prayer: say out loud what you are grateful for and things you need prayer for today.</p>

¹ Adonai spoke to Moses saying: ² "Speak to all the congregation of Bnei-Yisrael and tell them: You shall be kedoshim, for I, Adonai your God, am holy. ³ "Each one of you is to respect his mother and his father, and keep My Shabbatot. I am Adonai your God.

You are, as believers in Yeshua, part of the commonwealth of Israel, and these words spoken so long ago are also directed at you.

Isn't it interesting that the first item on Ad-nai's list of ways to be Kedoshim is respecting our parents?
