<p>IDENTITY: FOLLOWER OF G-D'S WORD</p> <p>5 MINUTES</p>	<p>Ask: Can G-D be trusted? Is HE responsible? Why or why not? What are a few ways that G-D's word from these verses been fulfilled?</p>	<p>Discuss: Are we responsible? Can we be trusted? Why or why not?</p>

<p>IDENTITY: DOER OF G-D'S WORD</p> <p>5 MINUTES</p>	<p>Who we are is largely dependent upon what we do; we honor our agreement by learning and keeping Torah, knowing that G-D has, and will continue to fulfil HIS promise to us!</p>	<p>Ask: Can we count on G-D to keep HIS promise? What does Yeshua mean when HE says; "If you love me keep my commandments."</p>
<p>GAME/ACTIVITY</p>	<p>Responsibility Game</p>	<p><<-a perfect reminder to round out Vayikra.</p>
<p>HOMEWORK</p> <p>3 MINUTES</p>	<p>Our letter of the month of Iyyar is ayin. Look around shul for something that begins with the sound like the English letter "a, ah, ee, o, or oo"; "Shavua tov, until next week!"</p>	<p>Close with prayer: say out loud what you are grateful for and things you need prayer for today.</p>

In life, there are many times where we make agreements where we promise to do something if the person we are agreeing with does something.

We do this in business, if you fix my car, I will pay you for fixing it. Maybe your parents have told you if you clean your room, they will get you ice cream or pizza.

Well, in this week's Parsha Ad-nai makes promises to Israel, but these promises are agreements like those above. Ad-nai promises that He will do things for Israel if Israel will follow Torah. Just remember that Ad-nai promises are eternal so just as Israel needed to keep Torah to receive the promises of Torah, we also need to keep Torah to receive those promises.
