**NOTES**

The first goal is to approach all scripture with humility and prayer.

In this week's Parsha Korach led a rebellion of 250 men against Moses. We read about this in Numbers 16:3:

**They assembled against Moses and Aaron. They said to them, "You've gone too far! All the community is holy—all of them—and Adonai is with them! Then why do you exalt yourselves above the assembly of Adonai?"**

What Korach and those rebelling against Moses said in modern language was. "Who put you in charge"? Moses' answer is a lesson that every young person needs to learn. Moses replied by going to prayer. Numbers 16:4:

**4When Moses heard this, he fell on his face.**

Or said another way Moses replied by saying "I am not in charge, Ad-nai is in charge." In your walk with Ad-nai, there are going to be times when people challenge you in the same way they challenged Moses. You always need to answer the same way. "I am not in charge, Ad-nai is in charge".
