I will strengthen you. Surely I will help you. I will uphold you with My righteous right hand.</p>
<p><b>IDENTITY: BELIEVER OF G-D'S WORD</b></p> <p>5 MINUTES</p>	<p>Ask: Do you think G-D cares about Pesach?</p>	<p>Discuss: What does G-D want us to do to celebrate HIS Passover?</p>
<p><b>IDENTITY: FOLLOWER OF G-D'S WORD</b></p> <p>5 MINUTES</p>	<p>Ask: What is the meaning of keeping the passover?</p>	<p>Discuss: Why do even Jewish non-believers keep the passover?</p>

<p><b>IDENTITY: DOER OF G-D'S WORD</b></p> <p>5 MINUTES</p>	<p>Who we are is largely dependent upon what we do; we act out our faith year after year remembering the Pesach Lamb slain for our redemption.</p>	<p>Ask: Do you sometimes feel like Yehudah who was a betrayer? Do you feel like Kefa who betrayed HIM? What is your relationship with Yeshua like? What would you like it to be like?</p>
<p><b>GAME/ACTIVITY</b></p>	<p>Counting the Omer?</p>	<p>&lt;&lt;-you can start where you are!</p>
<p><b>HOMEWORK</b></p> <p>3 MINUTES</p>	<p>Our letter of the month of Nisan is samech. Look around shul for something that begins with the sound like the English letter "s"; "Shavua tov, until next week!"</p>	<p>Close with prayer: say out loud what you are grateful for and things you need prayer for today.</p>

The first goal is to approach all scripture with humility and prayer.

As children, I am sure you enjoy going to parties. Did you know that Ad-nai commanded Israel to have three parties every year?

During Pesach (Passover), Shavuot (Pentecost) and Sukkot (Tabernacles) Ad-nai commanded Israel to have a huge celebration or party. They were commanded to save money all year long so that they could all afford to travel to Jerusalem for the party.

This week as part of our Parsha Deuteronomy 14:22-16:17 we read about the Mitzvot concerning this tithe and the commandment to use it for a party. Isn't that cool: Ad-nai commanded us to party!
