<p>IDENTITY: BELIEVER OF G-D'S WORD 5 MINUTES</p>	<p>Ask: Have you ever sinned unintentionally?</p>	<p>Discuss: Do we know all of the mitzvot of G-D?</p>

<p>IDENTITY: FOLLOWER OF G-D'S WORD</p> <p>5 MINUTES</p>	<p>Ask: What is the penalty for sin? What is required even for unintentional sin?</p>	<p>Discuss: What has G-D done HIMSELF to blot out our transgressions?</p>
<p>IDENTITY: DOER OF G-D'S WORD</p> <p>5 MINUTES</p>	<p>Who we are is largely dependent upon what we do; we repent when we discover we have sinned and trust G-D's word to redeem us.</p>	<p>Ask: What is repentance? How does Yeshua's WAY draw us to repentance? Does feeling bad mean you are repentant? Is feeling bad repentance?</p>
<p>GAME/ACTIVITY</p>	<p>The Repentance Game</p>	<p><<-does repentance mean our goals are discarded?</p>
<p>HOMEWORK</p> <p>3 MINUTES</p>	<p>Our letter of the month of Nisan is samech. Look around shul for something that begins with the sound like the English letter "s"; "Shavua tov, until next week!"</p>	<p>Close with prayer: say out loud what you are grateful for and things you need prayer for today.</p>

Well, did you know that a whole section of the sacrificial system which Ad-nai set up in Torah was given so that we could have atonement for exactly those kinds of sins? Sins that we commit unintentionally:

Things we do that are wrong to do, but we didn’t plan to do them, or we didn’t intend to do them. Think about that! Ad-nai loves us so much He provided a way for us to repent from things we would do that we didn’t mean to do.
