Small Group Questions

Week of July 12, 2026

Icebreaker:

If you could spend a day living on Sesame Street, who would you want to spend the day with and why? Or...

When you were a kid, what was one thing you were absolutely convinced was true that none of the adults seemed to believe?

Discussion Questions:

1. Rhoda recognized God's work almost immediately, while the adults in the room struggled to believe it. Why do you think familiarity with faith can sometimes make us slower—not faster—to recognize what God is doing?

2. In the sermon we talked about Luke choosing to name Rhoda, even though he could simply have called her "a servant girl." Why do you think God so often highlights people the world overlooks?

What does that reveal about God's character?

3. The church was praying for Peter while Peter was already walking toward the house. Can you think of a time when you only recognized God's answer after it had already begun unfolding?

What helped—or prevented—you from seeing it?

4. The sermon suggested that our role is often not to create miracles but to recognize and bear witness to what God is already doing. How does that change the way you think about sharing your faith?

5. Rhoda kept insisting on the truth even when no one believed her. Why is it sometimes difficult to speak up about what we know to be true?

What fears tend to silence us?

6. This week, where do you think you need to 'pay attention' for God's activity—in your family, workplace, neighborhood, or church?

What might it look like to intentionally recognize and join what He is already doing?
