# Packing List

## WHAT TO BRING

Bible, notebook, pencil, flashlight, water bottle, sleeping bag, pillow, (I like to bring a fitted sheet so I don't touch the mattress), toiletries, camera, warm and cool clothes, jacket, sandals, athletic shoes, modest one-piece swimsuit (no tankinis), \$75 recommended spending money, shower towel AND beach towel.

Check back in February to see the theme for this summer. Students will be wearing costumes and outfits to match the theme to win spirit points. You can also check the Hume Lake Ponderosa website for more details. Another Hume Lake tradition that is optional is that many HS students will dress up on the last night for dinner. Many wear sundresses or nice button up shirts for pictures.

GIRLS: No short shorts, crop tops, leggings, yoga/spandex pants or spaghetti straps, or two pieces

GUYS: No short shorts, no sagging of pants, no speedos, and you must keep your shirt on unless you are in the pool or lake.

## WHAT NOT TO BRING:

Drugs (unless prescribed by a doctor), alcohol, tobacco, fireworks, firearms, weapons, or electronic devices.

## WEATHER

- Warm, hot days & cool, cold nights.
- It doesn't usually rain, but it can!

# Additional Information

## CAMPER MEDICATION

- You will need to register every kind of medicine that your camper will have with Hume (including allergy and pain relievers).
- On the day of departure, you will need to place your student's medication, IN ITS ORIGINAL CONTAINER, and place it in a Ziplock bag. Write the camper's name, church name, and camp name (Ponderosa) on the bag.
- Turn in the medication to the Check-In table on the day of departure.
- If your student carries a rescue inhaler or an epi-pen, please have them check those in as well. They will be handed back to your student to keep with them once the nurse logs them in.

## EMERGENCIES

- A doctor and a nurse are provided for each week of camp
- There is a volunteer fire department on-site
- There are two on-call EMT staff daily
- There is a fully-stocked First Aid station with 24-hour access to counselors
- A registered nurse administers and ensures all daily medications are given to campers.

\*If there are any discipline issues or health reasons that necessitate your child leaving camp, you will be required to pick your child up from Hume Lake on the day you've been notified



# Additional Information

## MAIL

- You may send your camper packages mail/packages while they are at camp
- Mail is distributed daily, Monday - Friday after dinner
- It takes longer than normal to deliver packages to Hume, so please plan to mail 5 days in advance of when you would like your student to receive their package.
- If you plan on sending multiple packages, then make sure that you label them (clearly on the front of the package) the day that you would like them to be delivered. i.e. Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, otherwise they will all be delivered at one time.
- When you register with Hume Lake, you will have the option to sign up to send your camper emails. Please note: Your camper will not be able to send you any in return.

# Additional Information

## CABIN ASSIGNMENTS

We will make every effort to place small groups and friends together, however, it may be impossible for every camper to be placed with every friend. Over the years we have found that some of the deepest friendships have begun at camp by students who did not know each other previously. Parent and student flexibility is greatly appreciated.



## DEPARTURE

Students and parents will both need to arrive at 7am the Auxiliary lot of Centerpoint (Centerpoints extra parking across the street next to A+ dental) on Sunday July 5th. There, you will check in and fill out any missing paperwork and a small health screening with your student before they can leave on the bus.

## RETURN

We will arrive back at the church around 2:30pm in the Centerpoint parking lot. Students will be asked to contact you 30-60 minutes prior to arrival.

## PHONES

There is no cell reception at Hume Lake. This is a great time for students to disconnect from electronic devices. They will not need their phones during this trip as ETA and arrival info will be communicated back to you by one of our staff members. Students can easily lose or break their phone while at camp, so if possible, leaving their phones at home would be best.
