SECOND READING: Philippians 2:1-13

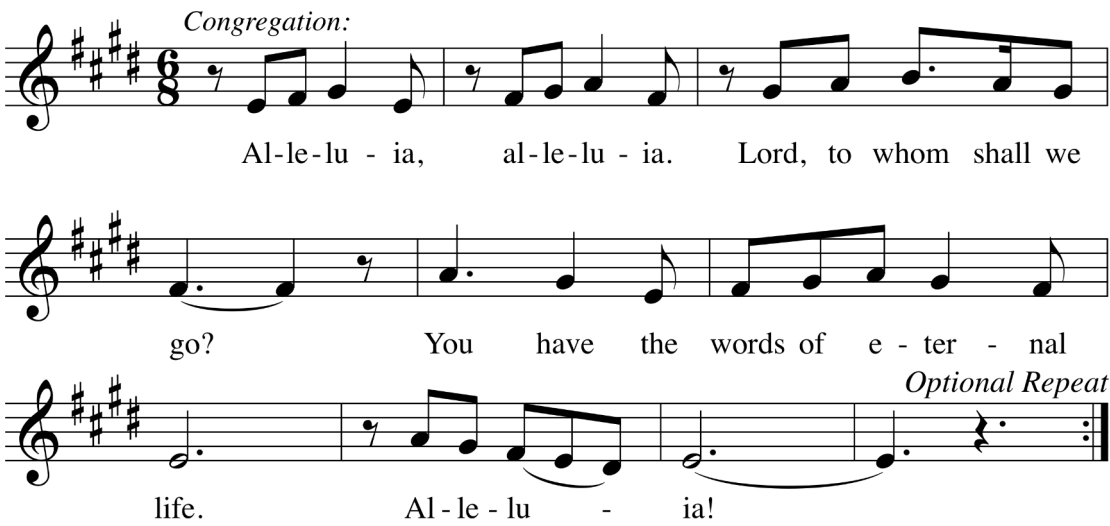

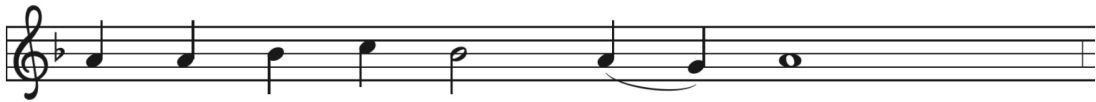

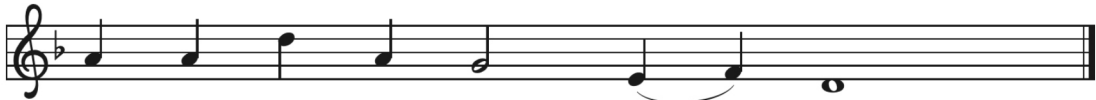
