Pastor Sharon's Sharings

In these last three months we have endured unimaginable hardship. The storm was



traumatic, but quick. The aftermath will bring us struggle for a long time. Yet, at the same time, in the aftermath, we continue to receive "grace upon grace" or grace and more grace!

The outpouring of prayer, love, support, and monetary assistance has been humbling. So many congregations and individuals have reached out and offered us their assistance. We are blessed to be a part of the Body of Christ!

On December 17, 2022 we engaged in our first discussion about the state of St. Peter and how to move forward. We quickly realized that this is going to be a long process. The engineering report is in the hands of the insurance adjuster. In the meantime, we continue to wait. St. Peter council is actively working and has made the decision to hire a public adjuster to assist in the process.

So we wait....but what is crucial for us to understand is that our waiting is an "active waiting".

To simply rebuild our structures without discerning our new mission and ministry is misguided. Our building is not the church. The assembled people of God active in worship and service is the living church. Buildings and physical facilities should always be used as a tool for the mission of the gospel. This is our opportunity to pray and brainstorm and dream and ask the hard questions about what God is now calling us to be on Fort Myers Beach. As we heard in our discussion, FMB, itself, has no idea what it will look like when the dust settles. We are all in the same process of slow, but steady, progress.

In this liminal space, this space between what is and what will be, please pray for wisdom, strength, and faithfulness as we seek to do God's will on the island. May this new year bring unexpected gifts and unfolding surprises. May this year bring "grace upon grace".

ST PETER CLEAN-UP RECAP November 28, 29, 30, 2022

Monday: 24 people were present during the workday of 9 am - 3 pm. Lunch was provided by Lutheran Disaster Response.

Tuesday: 14 volunteers were present.

Wednesday: 17 volunteers including Holiday Demolition and Debris Removal, Sharon Faircloth owner who sent three of her employees (at her cost)

The volunteers included four ELCA pastors; Jonathan Gantt, Rusty May (and PJ May), Matt Shapton, Timothy Taylor and representation from local congregations of Trinity-Gateway, Christus Victor, Messiah/North Fort Myers, Living Faith/Pembroke Pines, Community Church in the Ranch, St. Mark/Dunedin, and local volunteers from FMB, Avalon Preserve, and of course, our own St. Peter members past and present! We are so grateful for this response. (We actually had more volunteer requests but intentionally kept the numbers at 15 for safety purposes.)

These folks came and worked so hard cleaning the breezeway so that we could remove the moldy and ruined things out of the upstairs. They cleared out the furniture, washers and dryers, dishes, cabinets and other things you don't want to know about out from under the building. They carried it all to the curb and it was picked up and hauled away during the free cleanup period on the Beach.

We also give thanks for Pastor Jhon Freddy Correa who presided at St Peter worship while Pastor Taylor was down with the flu and covid. We are also grateful to Peace Lutheran Church and Pastor Andreas Stein for their generous hospitality as our host site. They are also hosting St. Michael and All the Angels Episcopal Church from Sanibel.

Proof of light

On January 6 Christians celebrate Epiphany, when the Magi came to worship baby Jesus. Epiphany, which means an appearance or manifestation, symbolizes the first recognition of the Savior by non-Jews. Because Epiphany also is a reminder that Jesus came as the light of the whole world, its symbols include light, candles and a star.

How did the wise men know — and how do we know — that Jesus is the light of the world? As preacher George Buttrick said, "It would little avail to ask how we know. That would be like asking how we know that Beethoven's 'Hymn to Joy' is joyous. If a man were to say, 'It is not joyous to me,' he would not condemn the music; he would tell only his morbidness. There is no logic to establish an axiom, for an axiom is the basis of all logic; and the soul of Jesus has axiomatic truth. Jesus is light, and there is no proof for light except light itself."
