



Still, the ability to make a clear and mature profession of faith and partake in the Lord's Supper in a manner that discerns the Lord's body often develops later. Your Session approaches these matters with sensitivity, understanding that this is not a judgment on the faith of younger children but rather an acknowledgment of their developmental stages. Exceptions exist for younger students who demonstrate exceptional understanding and readiness. The class will run for 9 weeks during the Sunday school hour, with weekly reading and homework assignments. The first class will meet on **Sunday, March 22nd**.
