





Communicants Class 2026: WPC is offering a class for children interested in becoming communing members of our church. Parents are strongly encouraged to enroll children in this class only if their children are demonstrating a Spirit-driven desire to profess faith in Christ and receive the Lord's Supper. As a general rule, the communicant's class is designed for children in fifth grade and above, as this age group typically possesses the maturity needed to articulate a profession of faith and regard the Lord's Supper with due reverence. We recognize that children younger than this may have genuine faith in Christ. Still, the ability to make a clear and mature profession of faith and partake in the Lord's Supper in a manner that discerns the Lord's body often develops later. Your Session approaches these matters with sensitivity, understanding that this is not a judgment on the faith of younger children but rather an acknowledgment of their developmental stages. Exceptions exist for younger students who demonstrate exceptional understanding and readiness. The class will run for 9 weeks during the Sunday school hour, with weekly reading and homework assignments. The first class will meet on **Sunday, March 22nd**. NEW Adult Discipleship Classes start NEXT WEEK, Sunday, March 15! WPC's Age and Stage Adult Classes are designed to provide opportunities for prayer, fellowship, and teaching. Classes are organized in age groupings with the goal of encouraging relational connections among people who are experiencing similar life circumstances. The following classes begin on March 15:

- **College Age: Spiritual Disciplines for the Christian Life.** This class covers the biblical foundations and practical rhythms of the spiritual disciplines—habits of grace that deepen communion with God. We will explore practices like prayer, Scripture study, and worship, learning how they strengthen faith amid the pressures of college life. Eric Fulcher will be the main teacher.
- **20s and 30s: Being God's Steward: Rethinking Money, Possessions & Eternity.** Money touches every part of life—earning, spending, saving, giving, and planning for the future. Is it a blessing, a burden, or both? Join us as we explore what God's Word teaches about true stewardship in light of eternity. Stacy Murphree will be the main teacher.
- **40s and 50s: Atonement: Crucial and Controversial.** To be a Christian is to believe that Christ has made atonement for our sins. But what does that mean? What is atonement? Why is it necessary? And how does it work? This class will give attention to this most crucial and sometimes controversial doctrine. Pastor McDaniel will be the main teacher.
- **60 and up: Christian Contentment: A Rare Jewel in a Restless Age.** Some say we live in an age of discontentment. The good news is, contentment can be learned. This class will dig into the New Testament teaching on contentment in Christ. We will also take a peek at some great Puritan writing on this important topic. Pastor St John will be the main teacher.

Other WPC Adult Discipleship Classes include a cross generational class that blends people from all stages of life and our own "seminary lite" BASIC Institute Class.

- **Cross Generational: Studies in 1 and 2 Thessalonians, 1 and 2 Timothy, and Titus.** This class will explore Paul's encouragement to young churches and pastoral leaders. Together we will consider themes of steadfast faith, sound doctrine, godly leadership, and perseverance in a challenging world. Robert Benton will be the main teacher.
- **The Basic Institute: OT 102: Prophets.** This course gives a historical/theological overview of the life of Israel after Moses' death into the era of deportation and exile while considering some of the main emphases of the prophets prior to and during that era. Pastor Cantrell will be the main teacher.
