A Note About Children In Worship: As our church continues to grow, we will have an increasing number of infants and toddlers in our worship services. Since we are a covenantal church, we greatly value our covenant children and unapologetically seek to assimilate them into corporate worship from the earliest ages. Watching God grow his church through the birth of covenant children is one of our greatest joys as a church! At the same time, an abundance of children does create some challenges for corporate worship. For a congregation like ours, which deeply values the ministry of the Word, it can be challenging for some members to concentrate and receive the Word when children make excessive noise during the service. Conversely, it can be challenging for parents of young children to receive the ministry of the Word if they constantly have to step out of the service to quiet their children. Rather than allowing these challenges to breed frustration within the body of Christ, the Session warmly recommends that we view them as an opportunity to express mutual love for one another.

For the members who would prefer the service to be silent as an aid to concentrated worship, we encourage you to express love to families with young children by bearing with the noise of our covenant children. For members whose children are especially vocal, we encourage you to express love to other members by temporarily removing your child from the service and using the narthex or nursery as needed. In both instances, we have an opportunity to heed the command of the Apostle Paul: *“walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace”* (Eph. 4:2–3).

NEW Adult Discipleship Classes start on Sunday, September 20! WPC's Age and Stage Classes are organized with the goal of encouraging relational connections. Most class topics will move through the stages this year. This means, if you are interested in the topic another Age and Stage group is studying, it will eventually make its way to the group you are in. The following classes begin on September 20:

- **College Age: A Study of Isaiah:** This class will dig into the Old Testament book Isaiah. You will enjoy learning about God's discipline of and loving faithfulness to the ancient

people of Israel. Additionally, you'll discover how to apply Isaiah in your life and enjoy the many gospel themes of the great book. Teacher: Ryan Brady

- **20s and 30s: Psalms:** The Psalms are one of the most beloved books in the Bible, but few other books have undergone such radical change in meaning and interpretation over the years. Our goal will be to see the Psalter as one intentionally crafted whole that has a key place in both the canon and the life of the church. Teacher: Pastor Cantrell
- **40s and 50s: Beyond Me:** God's heart for all peoples is evident throughout the Scriptures. In this course you will be challenged to look beyond yourself to God's heart for the nations and to be actively involved in the mission of God. Along the way, we pray you will learn to order your life around the Great Commission! Teacher: Pastor Roberts
- **60 and up: Christian Ethics and the Ten Commandments:** This class will explore the Ten Commandments as God's enduring guide for Christian ethics. Together, we will see how God's law exposes our need for Christ, directs us in grateful obedience, and equips us to pursue lives of holiness and love. Teacher: Robert Benton

Other WPC Adult Discipleship Classes include a cross generational class that blends people from all stages of life and our own "seminary lite" BASIC Institute Class.

- **Cross Generational: Studies in Genesis.** This class will explore the book of Genesis. Enjoy learning about God's purposes in the foundation of the universe and the foundation of his great covenant gospel promises! Teacher: Pastor Hale
- **The Basic Institute: Systematic Theology 103:** This class will give a brief overview of three important categories: soteriology (study of salvation), ecclesiology (study of the church), and eschatology (study of end times). This is a lecture style class with PowerPoint presentations and short video clips. Teacher: Cliff Smith.
