Chango and the property safe in our absence. We made the decision to come back a few weeks early when the second family to watch the property decided to stop coming. They asked us to come speak to the teens and talk about missions and give a gospel presentation. We had never been to their church and had no idea what to expect. When we walked in, they had prepared an entire Thanksgiving banquet and had us as the guests of honor. The



teens were extremely attentive as they listened to what God had laid on our hearts to share. What a blessing to be able to share God's goodness with future generations and how kind of our new friends to make us feel so welcome.

We could not possibly begin to share all God did or how He moved during this trip, but we have some very precious and special memories that we will treasure always. And of course, the Lord was working in our hearts and teaching us new things on this journey with Him. What is the Christian life if we

are not growing, stretching, and being put outside our comfort zones in service to Him?
