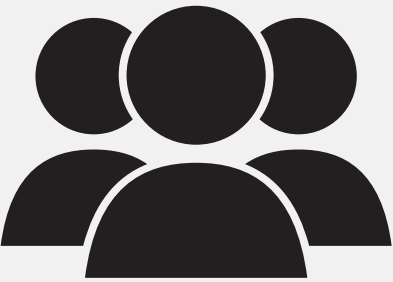


Social Domain



Description:

The social domain pays attention to the dynamics of connection and interaction. It's about understanding different cultures and personality types in order to get along as best as possible. Healthy relationships foster support and growth while unhealthy relationships tend to be self-centered and controlling.



Personal Example

Examples of the social domain from a personal perspective may include self-awareness and basic understanding of human behavior.



Family Example

The social domain in the family is about understanding the different personality types, how they affect you, and how you can try and create healthy relationships with them. It's also about participating in family traditions and cultural expectations.



Organization Example

Organizational examples of the social domain include cultural awareness of how relationships are developed in the environment of the group. Examples might look like chit-chatting during coffee breaks or understanding what behaviors are acceptable during meetings.



Government Example

The social domain in the government is about paying attention to the flow of personal and corporate interactions. These things can change from state to state, and office to office.
