

Strength/Security Domain



Description:

The strength and security domain is about knowing what is most important (values), protecting those, and using those as the foundation of strength for all efforts. A healthy relationship with this domain looks like unity in the sense that people know what they are about and fighting for. Unhealthy relationships look just disunity, skepticism, and disloyalty.



Personal Example

Examples of the personal strength are strong values, moral standards, codes of conduct, etc.



Family Example

Examples of family strength are when the personal examples above are articulated and agreed on. Even when family members don't get along, they might be willing to stand together for certain values. For example, "no one insults my sister but me."



Organization Example

Organizational examples of the the strength/security domain are well thought out policies and procedures that are focused on protecting and maintaining core values. These values should be so well established that even profit will be sacrificed before they are. For example, "We will not lie in order to make our product look better."



Government Example

The strength/security domain in the government is keeping the main values of the country/state protected at all costs. All laws and military/police efforts should always support the most fundamental values. For instance, freedom of speech has a high cost but is necessary for protectin a person's right to live free.
