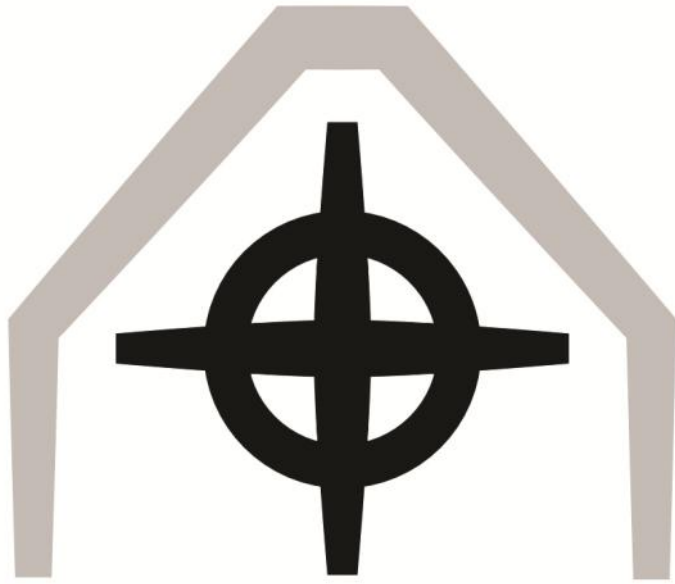

FIRST READING: EXODUS 12:1-14

A Reading from Exodus

The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household. If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbor in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to

the number of people who eat of it. Your lamb shall be without blemish, a year-old male; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats. You shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month; then the whole assembled congregation of Israel shall slaughter it at twilight. They shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. They shall eat the lamb that same night; they shall eat it roasted over the fire with unleavened bread and bitter herbs. Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted over the fire, with its head, legs, and inner organs. You shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn. This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the passover of the LORD. For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the LORD. The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt. This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the LORD; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.

SECOND READING: ROMANS 13:8-14

A Reading from Romans

Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, “You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet”; and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, “Love your neighbor as yourself.” Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law.

Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us live honorably as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

Episcopal Retirement Services (ERS) held their 75th anniversary celebration at Canterbury Court on August 21. Nancy Downey, liaison to Canterbury Court would like to thank Cathy Fain, Steve Ireland, Diane Labrie, Nedra Smolka, Pat Harbert, Bob and Micky Neben and Jack Koepke for attending the event. ERS was formed in 1951. During the presentation we learned about the growth of ERS from its beginnings thru today and their hope for the future. Canterbury Court became part of ERS in 1981 and was ERS's first affordable living complex.

There are various ways that St. Paul's supports Canterbury Court. Parishioners can volunteer at Canterbury's activities and events, donate specific items when asked or lead a craft class for the residents. There is also a group of residents and nonresidents that knit, crochet and do other handiwork. It meets at 3:00 on Wednesdays. Financial Executive Summary – June 2026 (1st half of 2026).

Total income including plate and pledge was \$15.4K for the month of June vs budgeted \$28.9K for a <\$13.5K> unfavorable balance.

Expenses for June were \$39.8K actual vs \$41K budgeted for a favorable balance of \$1.2K

Total monthly income for June vs total expenses gave us an unfavorable balance for the month of <\$24.4K>.

Year-to-date income through June is \$142K vs expenses of \$223K for a YTD unfavorable balance of <\$81.8K> for the first half of 2026.

*(Amounts shown are rounded up or down to the nearest \$100)

Executive Summary:

Expenses for the first half of 2026 have remained within budget range in almost all categories. Pledge and plate income have lagged behind during the past 3 months. Sue sent out statements in July with pledge balances still remaining and we have seen an uptick for the month of July. We have also been told a number of significant pledge amounts will be forthcoming early in the 3rd quarter. If all goes well, we should be able to go into the 4th quarter within striking distance of hitting our 2026 budget. Work is already underway on our 2027 budget, along with a 5-year financial projection in conjunction with the crafting our parish profile as part of the search process.
