Get to Know Me

1. What is the best thing your parents did that helped you succeed?

Into the Bible

Read Exodus 2:1-2

2. Moses's parents brought a child into a hostile and dangerous world. Many young couples struggle with the idea of having children in a troubled world. What do the following verses teach us about God's desire for people to have children if they can?
 - a. Genesis 1:26-28
 - b. Genesis 9:1
 - c. Psalm 127:3-5
3. In the previous chapter, we learn that Pharaoh had made a decree that the Hebrew boys should be killed at birth. Yet Moses' parents hid and protected him. Beside their instinct as parents to care for their children, what gave his parents the courage to protect Moses? See Hebrews 11:23 for more insight.

Read Exodus 2:3-4

4. Moses' mother obeyed the king's command to place her son in the Nile, but she also acted wisely and courageously to protect him by preparing a waterproof basket, placing him safely among the reeds, and watching over him through his sister. What does her example teach us about faithfully doing what we can while trusting God with the things beyond our control?
5. Christian parents have a duty to construct spiritual safeguards around their children before they send them off into the world. What are some spiritual safeguards that we can build up in our own lives to be better prepared for a world that is hostile to our walk with God?

Exodus 2:5-10

6. The combination of the protective actions of his mother and God's sovereign hand led to Moses being delivered from death. What does this say about how God will honor our acts of faith?
7. Pharaoh's daughter had compassion on the child and even hired his own mother to nurse him. Read Ephesians 3:20 and discuss what you learn about how God will work in our lives.
8. Moses' mother nursed him until he was ready to live permanently with Pharaoh's daughter. That time was not only valuable for his mom but was important to his growth and health as a baby. Read 1 Peter 2:2 and discuss what is needed for our spiritual growth and health as God's children.
