THIS WEEK'S LESSON: WRONGFULLY ACCUSED



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

Joseph's reputation took a hit when he was wrongly accused of a crime, but his character did not change. God wants us to maintain good character no matter what so that we can stay right with God. Genesis 39, Joseph is Jailed



HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Ask your kids if they understand what it means to have good character. Ask them how God can help them to become people of good character.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- Did Joseph deserve to be thrown in jail?
- Was Joseph a bad person, before or after he went to jail?
- How can God help us to remain people of good character?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"The Lord is a place of safety for those who have been treated badly. He keeps them safe in times of trouble." Psalm 9:9 (NirV)



PARENT TIME:

What you need to know:

Reputation is the way other people see us. Character is who we are even when no one is looking. Our reputation can take a hit, just like Joseph's, but that does not mean our character has changed. It takes hard work to remain a person of good character in challenging times, but with God's help, we can keep our good character so that we may be good witnesses for the faith.
