

Welcome to H2H Kids

A few introductory tips about Bible Study with Kids:

- *Remember how important it is to build relationships with the kids you are serving!*
- Bible Reading:
 - Please do not *make* kids read aloud if they don't want to
 - If you do have children read the Bible passages aloud, make sure everyone can hear and/or follow along. The Word should be clearly spoken.
 - A helpful tip: An adult can read but have kids following along in their own Bibles (if age appropriate) and you can stop on occasion and have kids say the word you paused at. This helps them stay engaged...and also allows the Word to be read with clarity and volume.
- Try to bring some type of visual to help illustrate the lesson. It goes a long way to capture kids' attention. It can be simple, while still giving them something to focus on and bringing abstract concepts to a concrete level.
- Try to get to these three levels: Observation, Interpretation, Application (as is age appropriate).
 - Observation: facts, clear understanding of what the passage is about
 - Interpretation: What does it mean? There is only one interpretation. What is the author and God saying? If it's abstract or maybe figurative, try to help kids discern the most simple and clear interpretation. If you are not certain, don't be afraid to say that!
 - Application: There will be many ways to apply scripture! Help the kids make it personal! What can we learn from this for our lives today?! How does this impact my life, my relationship with God, my understanding and knowledge of God?
- Less is More: *Please never feel like you must cover everything in the lesson.* Doing a good job on one concept is better than racing to "cover" everything. Feel free to simplify the lesson depending on the ages of the children in your group.
- During prayer time, do not make children pray aloud if they do not want to.
- *Remember how important it is to build relationships with the kids you are serving!*


ICEBREAKER: Who said it: Yoda or Proverbs?


Read the following quotes and ask Who Said it: Yoda or Proverbs?

- ★ Wise people store up knowledge, But the mouth of the foolish is near destruction. (Proverbs 10:14)
- ★ Powerful you have become, the dark side I sense in you. (Yoda)
- ★ Train yourself to let go of everything you fear to lose. (Yoda)
- ★ The highway of the upright is to depart from evil (Proverbs 16:17)
- ★ Whoever digs a pit will fall into it, And he who rolls a stone will have it roll back on him (Proverbs 26:27)
- ★ Death is a natural part of life (Yoda)
- ★ He who keeps instruction is in the way of life, But he who refuses correction goes astray (Proverbs 10:17)
- ★ But beware of the dark side; Anger, fear, aggression; the dark side of the Force are they (Yoda)
- ★ You will know the good from the bad when you are calm, at peace (Yoda)
- ★ He who earnestly seeks good finds favor, But trouble will come to him who seeks evil (Proverbs 11:27)

BIBLE DISCUSSION: Titus 3:1-7

- Introduction: The book of the Bible, Titus, is a letter written from Paul to a young pastor named Titus, who was on the island of Crete to establish the church. Paul was instructing Titus on how to train other believers as elders and overseers and was also writing about the faith and how Christians should live and behave.
- *Read Titus 3:1-2*
 - Who are we supposed to obey? (rulers and authorities)
 - Rulers and authorities are leaders in our community and our government.
 - When we obey rulers and authorities, what does this make us ready to do? (good works)
 - Explain that when one is a lawbreaker or a rule-breaker, it makes it harder to be effective at doing good works in Jesus' name.
 - How does verse 2 instruct us to treat others? (to be peaceable and gentle, not speaking evil of others, showing humility)
- *Read Titus 3:3*
 - How does verse 3 describe people who have not yet asked Jesus into their lives as Savior? (foolish, disobedient, deceived, serving lusts and pleasures, living in malice and envy, hateful and hating others)
