The Lord Has Done Great Things

Looking Back with Gratitude, Looking Ahead with Faith

"The LORD has done great things for us, and we are glad" (Psalm 126:3). Every time I read that verse, I picture the people of God stopping long enough to look back at what He has done — and letting that memory fuel their faith for what is ahead. That is exactly what I want us to do together here.

A Summer of Harvest

If you were anywhere near our campus this summer, you saw it: the fields really are "white for harvest" (John 4:35). Vacation Bible School was nothing short of remarkable. We enrolled 550 children, averaged 475 kids on campus every single day, and — here is the number I cannot get over — 43 children made decisions to trust Jesus as Savior. Three of those young believers have already followed the Lord in baptism. Behind every one of those numbers stood an army of volunteers — 340 of you signed up, with nearly 250 serving on any given day. When I watched our members kneeling down to pray with a child, I thought of Jesus' words: *"Let the little children come to me"* (Matthew 19:14). You made a way for them to come.

The harvest did not stop at the church doors. Our students carried the gospel to Puerto Rico, serving, sharing, and seeing God open hearts far beyond Fernandina Beach. Our children headed off to CentriKid Camp — 28 campers and their chaperones — and our students experienced God's presence at Camp Freestyle. Pray for these kids; camp is often where a lifetime of ministry begins.

Closer to home, the Christian Heritage Parade and Christian Heritage Sunday reminded our whole community that this church has been standing on this island, proclaiming this gospel, for generations. As we shared a meal together at the luncheon, I could not help but think of Psalm 145:4 — *"One generation shall commend your works to another."*

And then there are the baptisms. Nearly every time we have gathered this year, the waters have been stirred — and each person who has stepped into that baptism represents a story of grace, a life made new. If you have been putting off that step of obedience, this fall would be a wonderful time to take it.

Looking to the Fall Fields

You do not celebrate a harvest by sitting down — you sharpen the sickle and go back to the field. And the fall fields are full.

Work continues on our Central Nassau Campus, extending our reach to families in the heart of the county, and the North Property Outreach Center is taking shape as a launching pad for ministry to our neighbors. These are not building projects — they are gospel projects, and your giving is making them possible.

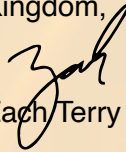
Growth Track classes return in September and November — if you are new to our church family, or you are ready to move from sitting to serving, this is your next step. Our Fall Bible Studies will launch across every generation, and our choir is already preparing a Fall Choral Concert that will lift your heart.

Mark your calendar for Beach Baptisms — there are few things more powerful than watching someone rise from the waters of the Atlantic to walk in newness of life. Our Global Impact Celebration will refresh our vision for the nations, and the Fall Festival will once again throw open our doors to thousands of our neighbors. Every one of these is an open door — walk through it, and bring someone with you.

Don't Grow Weary

Church, *"let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up"* (Galatians 6:9). Every child who trusted Christ at VBS, every student who came home from camp changed, every person raised from the baptismal waters — that is the return on your prayers, your serving, and your faithful giving. Thank you. So keep praying, keep serving, and keep giving. The God who did great things this summer is not finished with First Baptist Fernandina Beach — the best fields are still ahead.

And through it all, one thing is certain: there is no stopping what God can and will accomplish when His people move forward in faith. Heaven's the limit!

Serving Our Community

Sharing Christ's Love Through Practical Care, Meaningful Partnerships, and Community Outreach

As summer comes to an end, our Community Outreach Ministry continues to stay busy, and we are excited about what God has planned for the months ahead.

Our kitchen ministry continues to be a tremendous blessing to our church and community. Each month, we serve more than 1,000 meals through our Wednesday evening dinners. In addition, we serve meals at Hope House on 9th Street twice each month, providing an average of 237 meals over the last three months. We also deliver approximately 235 meals each month to those who are homebound. What an incredible ministry! We are so thankful for Carol Baugh and her faithful team of volunteers who make this possible week after week.

We recently celebrated the dedication of our new FBFirst Community Resource Center (North Property). It was a special evening with members from both our Island and Central Campuses, along with friends from the community. I had the privilege of sharing a few remarks, and Pastor Zach Terry led us in a prayer of dedication and anointed the property with oil. Afterwards, everyone walked the property, praying over the buildings and the future ministry that will take place there. It was a meaningful and memorable time. We still have a few projects to complete, with the most significant being the installation of our septic system.

The Resource Center is already beginning to fulfill its purpose. We currently host two Bible studies and will continue adding community resources as the buildings are completed. Each month, representatives from local nonprofit organizations gather to share resources, strengthen partnerships, and work together to address some of the biggest



challenges facing Nassau County, including housing, mental health, and access to essential services.

One immediate need is for licensed hair stylists who can serve from 4:00–5:30 pm one Wednesday evening each month. This simple act of service can make a tremendous difference in someone's life.

Our desire is to help people take their next right step by connecting them with the resources they need while always pointing them to Jesus.

As students prepare to head back to school, our Missions team has adopted the local foster care program as one of our ministry priorities. This year, we have the privilege of supporting 62 foster children and their foster families as they begin a new school year. We are excited to provide encouragement and practical assistance as these children experience a fresh start.

Thank you for your continued prayers, generosity, and willingness to serve. Together, God is allowing us to make a lasting difference in the lives of individuals and families throughout Nassau County.

The Unsung Hero of Faith:

Honoring Jerry Greeson

Some people change lives from a stage. Others change lives one classroom, one conversation, and one Sunday at a time.

For more than 50 years, Jerry Greeson has faithfully taught God's Word—preparing lessons, praying for class members, encouraging believers, and investing in generations of people. While few will ever know the countless hours he devoted to this ministry, only eternity will reveal the full harvest of his faithfulness.

Jerry's influence extends far beyond the walls of a Sunday School classroom. Those he disciplined have gone on to disciple their own children, who are now passing those same biblical truths to the next generation. His life reflects Paul's words in 1 Corinthians 3:6:

"I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth."

Jerry has faithfully watered the lives God placed in his care, trusting Him for the results.

His faithful service has also impacted his community and country. A Fernandina Beach native, Jerry served as a U.S. Army Sergeant during the Vietnam War, flying more than 600 combat helicopter missions and receiving the Vietnam Air Medal with 10 Oak Leaf Clusters and the "V" Device for Valor.

After returning home, Jerry spent more than 50 years serving Nassau County in leadership roles including Chief Deputy Clerk, Clerk of Court, and Chief of Staff. He also invested in the community through organizations such as the United Way, youth athletics, the Chamber of Commerce, and the National Day of Prayer, helping establish Amelia Island's first observance.

Yet those who know Jerry best would probably tell you that none of those accomplishments are what

define him. If you asked Jerry what has mattered most, he would simply point you to Christ.

For more than five decades, Jerry has taught God's Word and for 47 years has served as a Deacon. His life is a testimony of humility, consistency, and steadfast faith.

This year, our church had the privilege of honoring Jerry with the Christian Statesman Award during Christian Heritage Sunday. The award recognizes individuals who exemplify Christian leadership, integrity, public service, and a commitment to Christ and country. Jerry's life reflects each of these qualities with quiet consistency.



Jerry and Gail recently celebrated 61 years of marriage. Together they have modeled a life of faithfulness and built a legacy that continues through their two children, Heath and Hope, and their five grandchildren..

While awards are meaningful, Jerry's greatest reward is not found in earthly recognition but in the countless lives he has pointed to Christ and the promise every faithful servant longs to hear:

"Well done, good and faithful servant."
— Matthew 25:23

Thank you, Jerry, for faithfully serving your church, your community, and your country. Your life reminds us that the greatest legacy is built through a lifetime of faithful obedience. Only heaven will reveal the full harvest of the seeds you faithfully planted and watered.

One “YES” Can Change Everything

Unexpected Joy, Deeper Faith, and a Heart for Serving Others

Growing up, I watched my Granny serve tirelessly at her church. Despite her example, it took me a long time to get involved, and, while embarrassing to admit, my first volunteer experience was more selfish than selfless. I refused to leave my children somewhere I wasn't, which meant becoming a volunteer. Thankfully, God works with what we give Him. He grows it to accomplish His purpose while also growing us.

In 2022, before moving to Fernandina Beach, I signed up to serve at my first VBS. I volunteered for snacks but was moved to...crafts. YIKES! Despite feeling out of my element, I showed up. I didn't realize it then, but God had a plan. It became the best week of my church life! I instantly felt connected—I was no longer a spectator but a participant. Every year after that, I eagerly signed up for crafts.

In 2025, we moved to the area and began attending FBFirst. Zach Zettler was one of the first people we met, and he immediately made us feel welcome. Soon afterward, we participated in SERVE Weekend, and when the VBS volunteer email arrived, I signed up for crafts without hesitation. From experience, I knew VBS was one of the fastest ways to get connected to a church family—and I had grown to love serving there.

God wasn't finished. In just four years, I went from a reluctant volunteer to a VBS Crafts Leader. He took the little I offered and

grew my heart for serving others. Looking back, I realized I had even prayed for the opportunity to serve in this exact way after we moved. *“And this is the confidence that we have toward Him, that if we ask anything according to His will He hears us.”* (1 John 5:14)

Like many people, I almost let excuses keep me from saying yes: I'm too busy. This is too big. Am I capable? But I can tell you firsthand—you will never regret saying “yes” when God calls.

This year, leading the Craft Team taught me even more.

First, there is a place for everyone to serve. VBS requires volunteers long before the first child walks through the doors. Some prepare crafts and decorations for months. Others transform the church the week before VBS. Some serve directly with children, while others quietly counsel kids who want to know more about Jesus. Every role matters.

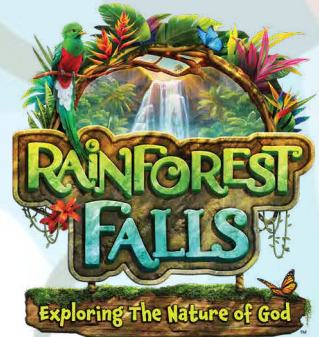
Second, every rotation is an opportunity to share the gospel. One day in crafts, we talked about how sin damages our hearts using examples children could understand—lying, bullying, cheating, and stealing. As we placed a red heart, representing Jesus' blood, over our sinful hearts, one reluctant child suddenly engaged. Convicted by what he had heard, he later went to decision counseling and chose to follow Jesus.



Finally, serving doesn't just impact children—it encourages fellow volunteers, too. During VBS, I gave each member of the Craft Team a handwritten thank-you card. The following Wednesday, grandparents of one teenage volunteer stopped me after church to share how much that simple note had meant. Their granddaughter proudly shared it with the entire family. They were grateful someone had taken the time to encourage the teens and remind them they were valued.

There are countless other stories of how God has worked in my life through VBS. Moments like these happen when we simply say yes. You may feel you don't have enough time, talent, energy, or experience, but God can take whatever you're willing to offer and use it to change someone's eternity. As the Parable of the Talents reminds us, God has entrusted each of us with gifts to use for His Kingdom. My prayer is that one day we will all hear those wonderful words: *“Well done, good and faithful servant.”* (Matthew 25:23)

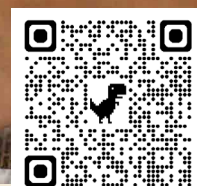

A Tradition of Excellence That Continues to Grow

This year, Jack & Jill Preschool celebrates 70 years of God's faithfulness as a ministry of FBFirst.

Founded in 1956 by our first director, Marguerite Fox, the preschool began with just 12 students seated around three tables—the Red Bird, Yellow Bird, and Blue Bird tables. Those table names soon became classroom names and, for generations of students, treasured memories. Even today, many former students proudly remember which “bird” they were. Although the church relocated in 2008 and the classroom names changed, the legacy of those early years continues.

Over seven decades, Jack & Jill has grown from 12 students to nearly 80

children, serving 2-, 3-, and 4-year-olds while remaining committed to providing a loving, Christ-centered environment where children grow academically, socially, emotionally, and spiritually.

God has faithfully provided dedicated leadership through the years, including Marguerite Fox (1956–1981), Sandra Reynolds (1981–1988), Sharon Quarterman (1988–2001), Robin Burbank (2001–2011), Dee Dee Thornton (2011–2021), and Serena Fleming (2021-present). Their faithful service has impacted countless children and families.

As we celebrate this milestone, we thank First Baptist Church, our teachers, staff, and generations of families for making Jack & Jill a place where children experience the love of Jesus. We look forward with gratitude and anticipation for all God will continue to do in the years ahead.
