

My earliest recollection of Lent was like many, and that is our Catholic

through the ages have used this time of Lent as a time of training new

friends and classmates giving up chocolate once a year. Growing up in a Baptist preacher's home, we always observed the "big 2," Christmas and Easter, but I did not come to know about, and appreciate a more in-depth church calendar until studying vocal and choral music in college and, also, the influence of other-non-Baptist traditions in my life at that time. In a super simplistic form, Lent, is to Easter as Advent is Christmas—a period of preparing one's self for the "big-2." My testimony to the impact of these periods of preparation each year is that it teaches a deliberate shift in our day-to-day focus on Christ. Lent is a 40-day period (not counting Sundays) before Easter. This is a time for praying and introspection, repentance, fasting, and deepening our faith in Christ Jesus. Many who give up something during Lent fill that void with self-examination, building their relationship with Jesus, and gratitude for all that was accomplished through Christ's death, burial, and resurrection. Many churches

believers and preparing them for baptism. Training would take place in the key tenants of faith, and what it means to live for and follow Christ. The new class of converts then would be baptized on Easter Sunday. When we think of Lent in this way, as a time of preparation for a very big celebration—Easter Sunday—these 40 plus days of preparation have real meaning. We would like to invite you to use the month of March to draw closer in your walk with Jesus. We would also like to use the month or March as a time of outreach. Please take a moment right now to ask God for a name of someone you can invite. Be in prayer through the weeks ahead about people that you could invite to visit Central. We will talk about this more and we will have a card available that you can use to invite family, friends, neighbors to our Easter Sunday worship as well as the other events that will take place that weekend. May God give us the courage to be a light to our city!
