CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

Thanks to our Building and Grounds committee for the work they do to keep “this old church” up and running. It is not a small task. A special thanks to David Crow and Jess Newsom for the work they have been doing to find creative ways to repair and restore our sanctuary ceiling. If you were unable to attend our last business conference, you missed the proposal that we install a “dropped ceiling” in place of repainting and doing plaster repair, again. The dropped ceiling will be about 4 inches from the



current ceiling and will maintain the current architectural lines of what now exists. The ceiling tiles will be a sheetrock tile with a vinyl covering and should not change the acoustics of the sanctuary. Part of the project requires having an electrician to lower the lighting into the new ceiling. We see this as a long-term solution to a re-occurring problem.

Multiple bids have been received, and the proposal we would like to entertain is between \$62-\$70k. We will have to be out of the sanctuary for up to 4 weeks while the job is completed. The project would take place sometime this summer.

We have money available to complete this project in our contingency funds, but we also have other sizable projects that will need to be completed in the near future. Should you be willing to contribute to this project via a one-time gift, or a monthly pledge above and beyond your normal giving, we would appreciate hearing from you. This project will be voted on at our regular May business conference that is scheduled for May 24 following worship. More details about this project are available in the Visitor's Center or you can visit with a member of the Building and Grounds Committee.
