#### QUICK UPDATES

#### CONNECT

When you think about the idea of final judgment, what emotions or thoughts come to mind first - fear, hope, confusion, urgency, something else?

#### REVIEW

Have someone read the passage out loud from the ESV translation or something similar. Reflect on any insights, questions, or parts that stood out from the text or the sermon. Then read the summary below.

*Revelation 20 shows us a powerful picture of reality from heaven's perspective. During the present age, Christ is reigning, Satan is limited, and the gospel is advancing to the nations. Believers who die are not defeated but are with Christ, reigning with Him, awaiting resurrection. At the end, Satan will face final and decisive judgment, and every person will stand before the throne of God. Those who trust in Christ stand not on their works but on His finished work, and this truth fuels both our hope and our mission.*

#### LEARN & LIVE

*These questions help us grasp the truth of the passage and consider how to live it out.*

- What stands out to you most from this passage or sermon - and why?
- What does this chapter show us about what is true *right now*, not just in the future?
- How would you describe the current state of Satan's power based on this text?
- What do you think John wants suffering or discouraged believers to feel when they hear this?
- Why is it important that Revelation gives us "heaven's perspective" on reality?
- What do you notice about how quickly Satan's final defeat happens? What might that communicate?
- What does the image of the "books" and the "book of life" reveal about God's justice?
- How does this passage hold together both justice and grace?
- What feels confusing or unresolved for you in this chapter? (Name it honestly)
- If you had to summarize Revelation 20 in one sentence, what would you say?

#### GO DEEPER

*These questions invite us to slow down and wrestle with what's going on beneath the surface. Use these to go a little deeper or in your Huddle Groups.*

- How does knowing Christ is reigning right now change the way you face stress or uncertainty this week?
- Where do you feel like evil or brokenness is winning - and how does this passage speak into that?
- What would it look like for you to live with more confidence that the enemy is limited?
- How does the reality of standing before God one day shape your priorities today?
- What does it mean, practically, to stand on the work of Jesus instead of your own?
- Where are you tempted to "measure yourself" by your own goodness or performance?
- How does this passage challenge the way you think about people who don't yet know Christ?
- What is one small way you could step into mission this week (conversation, invite, prayer)?

- Does the promise of life with Christ after death bring comfort or does it feel distant to you? Why?
- What would change in your daily life if you really believed: “My faithfulness is not wasted”?
- **How is the Holy Spirit comforting you or challenging you personally from this discussion? How will you respond and what will you do differently this week? Is there anywhere you need help to make that happen?**

### **PRAY FOR NEEDS in the GROUP**

- Some other ways to pray:
  - Pray about one way God spoke to you tonight through His Word
  - Pray by name for one person you know who is far from God..

### **5 GROUP DISCUSSION RULES**

We want to be full of grace as we meet, deepening our relationship with one another and with Christ. These five values help us know our **P.L.A.C.E.** in our GC's and Huddles.

1. **Pray** - *Prayer is a space for confession, struggle, and praise. Keep requests focused on yourself and your immediate family, so we can pray specifically and personally.*
2. **Listen** - *Be present and attentive. Share with humility, be mindful of time, and remember: silence is okay.*
3. **Apply** - *Answer honestly. Consider how God's Word speaks into your life, and what it might look like to respond.*
4. **Confess** - *Confession and repentance are signs of maturity. We meet one another with grace, not shame.*
5. **Encourage** - *Practical advice is helpful, but truth is better. Speak the gospel into each other's hearts and stories.*
