The Flood: Part 2  
March 8, 2026

## **PART 1: RECAP. HAVE SOMEONE READ THIS OUT LOUD.**

This week we are continuing through the story of the flood in Genesis 6, 7, and 8. Last week we focused on how Noah's faithfulness and obedience is a reminder of how God calls us to be like Him. Now we are looking at the significance of how God remembered Noah, and how God remembers us today too. When we realize that God is in the business of salvaging the broken and messy parts of our lives we can't help but respond in worship to Him.

- Have you ever forgotten something that ended up being a big deal? How did you react when you realized you forgot? (A birthday, a presentation, car registration, etc.)
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## **PART 2: HAVE SOMEONE READ GENESIS 8:1-22 AND 9:7-17. OUT LOUD. ANSWER THESE QUESTIONS AS A GROUP.**

- What is the significance of the statement, "But God remembered Noah ..."?
  - Why did God decide to never destroy the human race again, even though mankind is still evil?
  - What is the covenant God made with Noah and his sons?
  - How does this story point forward to the gospel of Jesus?

- Knowing that God is in the business of salvaging the messes we make, how can we respond?
- What part of your testimony (faith story) do you think someone needs to hear? How can you share God's grace and goodness this week?
