**PART 1: RECAP. HAVE SOMEONE READ THIS OUT LOUD.**

Last week we celebrated Easter, where we read through Genesis 22 to the story of Abraham and Isaac. We saw that God provides the right thing, at the right place, at the right time - just like He provided for Abraham and Isaac, and just like He provided for us through the sacrifice of his son Jesus. This week we are looking at Genesis 12 where God called Abraham, promised to bless him and his descendants, and through them to bless all the nations of the earth.
