PART 1: RECAP. HAVE SOMEONE READ THIS OUT LOUD.

As we've been working through the life of Joseph, focusing on his integrity and character. Our passage this week picks up about two years after our passage ended last week. Joseph had been forgotten in prison, but we see that he has remained faithful and obedient even in his difficult situation. The main themes we see in this passage are that God keeps his promises, he offers hope during affliction and rest for the weary, and eternal life.

- Share something specific you have been thankful for this last week.
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PART 2: HAVE SOMEONE READ GENESIS 41:1-44 OUT LOUD. ANSWER THESE QUESTIONS AS A GROUP.

- Why does Joseph emphasize that the interpretation of these dreams is from God, and not himself?
 - Does it seem like the upcoming famine is a judgment from God or just part of the natural ongoing cycles of life? How does this famine connect to the timing of our story?
 - What type of response is required by the people? Repentance in the face of judgment, wise precautions in the face of a helpful warning, or something else?
 - What do you think of the Pharaoh's decision to make Joseph second in command? How does all this fit into God's providence for Israel?

PART 3: REFLECT. ANSWER THESE QUESTIONS TOGETHER.

- Have you ever felt forgotten, either by others or even by God? Share about how that situation made you feel and how it ended.
 - What sort of things make it hard to trust God's promises? How can you overcome those roadblocks?
 - What are you hoping God will do in your life during this season? Are you trusting him with open hands or struggling to do so?
 - Who in your life are you intentionally pursuing a relationship with so they can know the love of God?

- I will trust God's timing during seasons of waiting.
