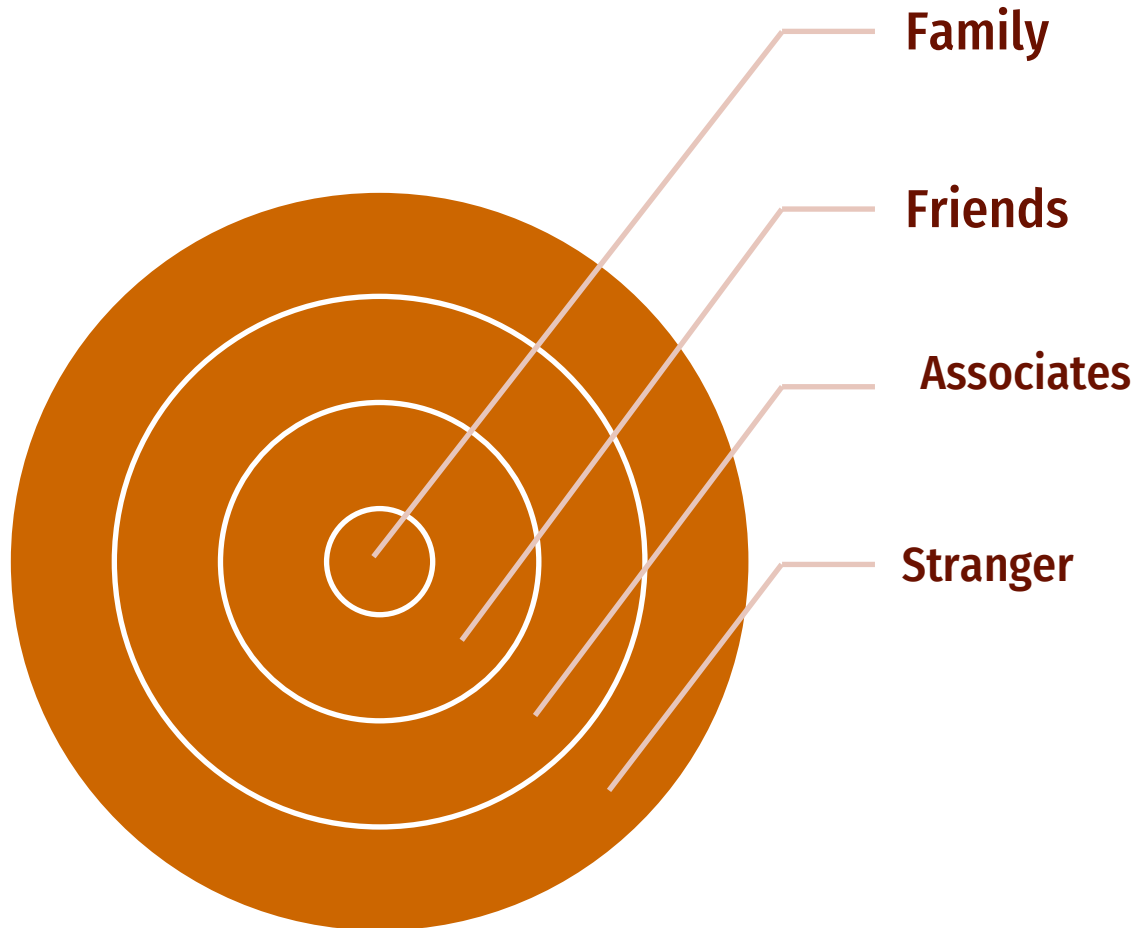








Concentric Circles

| 1 | Philippi | Acts 16:19–40 | Paul and Silas were beaten with rods and placed in prison after Paul cast a spirit of divination out of a slave girl. At midnight they prayed and sang hymns. God sent an earthquake, the jailer was converted, and Paul later revealed he was a Roman citizen. |

| # | Imprisonment | Biblical Support | Notes |
|---|---|---|--|
| 2 | Jerusalem / Roman custody after temple riot | Acts 21:27–36; 22:24–30; 23:10–11 | Paul was seized in the temple, nearly killed by a mob, and taken into Roman custody. He was held in the barracks, examined by the tribune, and later encouraged by the Lord: “Take courage...” |

| # | Imprisonment | Biblical Support | Notes |
|---|--------------|---|---|
| 3 | Caesarea | Acts 23:23–35; 24:22–27; 25:1–12 | Paul was transferred to Caesarea under Roman guard. Felix kept him imprisoned for two years: “When two years had elapsed, Felix was succeeded by Porcius Festus.” |

| # | Imprisonment | Biblical Support | Notes |
|---|--------------------------|---|--|
| 4 | First Roman imprisonment | Acts 28:16, 30–31; Philippians 1:12–14; Ephesians 3:1; 4:1; 6:20; Colossians 4:3, 10, 18; Philemon 1, 9, 23 | Paul lived under house arrest in Rome for two whole years, receiving visitors and “proclaiming the kingdom of God... with all boldness and without hindrance.” This is likely the imprisonment during which he wrote Philippians, Ephesians, Colossians, and Philemon. |

|---|--------------------------------|-----------------------------------|--|
| 5 | Later/final Roman imprisonment | 2 Timothy 1:8, 16–17; 2:9; 4:6–18 | This appears to be a later and harsher imprisonment than Acts 28. Paul says he is “bound with chains as a criminal” and speaks as though his death is near: “the time of my departure has come.” |
