Rector's Message

As we prepare to leave our church building and begin the work of demolition and rebuilding, I find myself in the mixture of emotions that accompanies any significant transition.

For some, this season brings excitement and anticipation. We have achieved remarkable milestones together. The project has received unanimous approval from the Naples City Council. We have reached and surpassed our initial capital campaign goal. We are addressing the vulnerabilities exposed by Hurricanes Ian and Milton and building a church that can serve generations to come.

For some, there is sadness. This building has been the setting for baptisms, confirmations, weddings, funerals, and countless Sunday mornings. It is where we have encountered Christ, deepened our faith, been inspired by organ and song. It is where we have experienced God's grace.

Most of us, I suspect, are experiencing some combination of both. I know that is true for me.

My own journey through this mix did not begin with construction drawings or capital campaigns. It began standing in a flooded church with my family after Hurricane Ian and continued through the difficult days following Hurricane Milton. I still remember the overwhelming emotions of moving the altar after the storms, seeing firsthand the damage that had been done, and realizing that decisions about resilience were pressing.

There was genuine grief in those moments. And yet there was also the beginning of hope.

The Christian story teaches us that grief and hope are not opposites. We encounter them together whenever we stand at the threshold between what has been and what God is calling into being. Every baptism involves a dying and rising. Every funeral is shaped by resurrection hope. The Church itself was born through the pattern of Good Friday and Easter morning.

That is why it is important to acknowledge that we are not all feeling the same thing—and that is perfectly appropriate. Some will feel excitement. Some will feel relief. Some will feel anxiety. Some will feel grief. Many will feel all of these emotions at once. None of those responses are signs of weak faith. They are signs that we care deeply about what God has done in this place and what God will continue to do through this parish family.

When we process from the church into the Parish Hall on September 6, we will not be abandoning our church. Rather, we will be carrying forward its mission. The building's life will come to an end, but the life of the Church will continue in anticipation of a new beginning.

As Christians, we know that resurrection follows death, that hope emerges from loss, and that Christ remains faithful in every season. So, with gratitude for the past, honesty about our feelings, and confidence in God's future, onward we go into the next chapter of Trinity-by-the-Cove's ministry.

Our Resilience Journey

The journey toward a new church is unfolding in carefully planned phases designed to preserve our ministry while preparing for the future.



City and Regulatory Approval

Our first priority is securing the necessary city approvals, permits, and regulatory clearances. During this phase, architects, engineers, and consultants have been working closely with local authorities to ensure the new church meets all applicable building, safety, and flood-resiliency requirements while honoring the beauty and character of our historic church. We have secured unanimous approval from the Planning Advisory Board and the City Council. The Design Review Board will review our plan in August and then building permits will be pursued.

Commencing Our Building

Once approvals are obtained and with funding goals met, construction can begin. We anticipate this to begin in September. Site preparation will be undertaken with great care, including measures to protect the surrounding churchyards and preserve treasured elements of the current building. The new elevated structure will incorporate modern flood-resistant design while faithfully reproducing the architectural beauty, craftsmanship, and sacred atmosphere that have long defined Trinity-by-the-Cove.



Interim Worship

Throughout construction, worship and parish life will continue uninterrupted. Services will be held in the Parish Hall, allowing our congregation to gather, celebrate the sacraments, and remain connected while the new church rises around us. Though our location may be temporary, our common life and mission will remain largely unchanged.



Dedicating Our New Building and Organ

The final phase will include the installation of furnishings, completion of interior finishes, landscaping, and the placement of the replacement organ. Many cherished elements from our current church—including the altar, pews, pulpit, bells, weather vane, and other salvaged features—will find new life in the completed building. When construction is finished, we will gather in thanksgiving to dedicate our new church and organ, celebrating God's faithfulness and the beginning of a new chapter in Trinity-by-the-Cove's history.

A Thoughtful Transition

As we prepare for the demolition and rebuilding of our church building, we will incorporate additional elements from the Book of Common Prayer into our regular 10 a.m. Sunday liturgy. These additions are intended to help us understand this important transition through the lens of the Christian life and the sacramental life of the Church. Rather than seeing this season only as a construction project, we will mark it as a time of prayer, remembrance, gratitude, and hope.

Pastoral Care

On August 2, with Mother Marcella preaching, we will begin by focusing on pastoral care and the mutual love Christians are called to show one another. The theme will be "Bearing One Another's Burdens." This Sunday will remind us that the Church is first and foremost a community formed by the compassion of Christ and sustained by the care we offer one another. Buildings matter, but the heart of the Church is the people of God gathered in love, prayer, and service.



Faith and Trust

On August 9, with Fr. Nicholas preaching, we will focus on Faith and Trust. The Gospel reading offers the image of Peter stepping out of the boat to follow Jesus, the service will invite us to reflect on the Christian call to trust God amid uncertainty and change. Just as Peter was invited to leave the safety of the boat, we are invited to move into the future trusting that Christ is already there before us.



Baptism

On August 16, with Father Edward preaching, we will turn our attention to Holy Baptism. Following the sermon, the congregation will renew the Baptismal Covenant and be asperged with holy water. The central message of this service is that our identity as the Church is rooted in baptism. Before we had this building, we had the waters of baptism. Through baptism, we are joined to Christ and to one another, becoming members of his Body and inheritors of his promises

Marriage and Covenant

On August 23, with Father Nicholas preaching, we will focus on Marriage and Covenant. Using prayers drawn from the marriage liturgy, the service will reflect on the ways Christian communities, like Christian marriages, are sustained by faithfulness, commitment, forgiveness, patience, and love. This Sunday will remind us that what ultimately binds us together is not a building, but a covenant life in Christ.



A Holy Commendation

Death and Resurrection

On August 30, with Father Steve preaching, we will turn to the themes of death and resurrection. Drawing on portions of the Burial Office, we will acknowledge both the grief and the hope that accompany this season. As we prepare to leave our church building, we will remember that Christians entrust all things to God, and that in Christ, life is changed, not ended.



A Visual Expression



As a visual expression of these themes, three four-foot by four-foot banners will be displayed in the church on the respective Sundays. Each banner will feature our rose window and focus on one sacramental moment in the life of the parish. Within the panes of the rose window will appear the names of parishioners who have been baptized at Trinity-by-the-Cove, married at Trinity-by-the-Cove, or entered eternal life here. These banners will make visible a central truth: the Church is not ultimately a building, but a people whose lives have been shaped by Christ through the ministries carried out in this holy place.

Commendation and Sacred Procession

Then, on September 6, with Father Edward preaching and celebrating, we will gather for our final 10 a.m. service in the church and include a liturgy of thanksgiving and commendation. We will give thanks for generations of worship, prayer, baptisms, marriages, funerals, and acts of service that have taken place within these walls. Following Holy Eucharist, we will commend the building to God's continuing purposes and process the altar, Gospel Book, and other symbols of our common worship to the Parish Hall, where we will continue to gather during construction.

Together, these Sundays will trace the arc of the Christian life: care, baptism, covenant, death, and resurrection hope. They will help us approach this transition not with anxiety or nostalgia alone, but with gratitude, faith, and confidence in God's future. The Church is not leaving; only the building is. Christ remains present wherever his people gather in his Name.

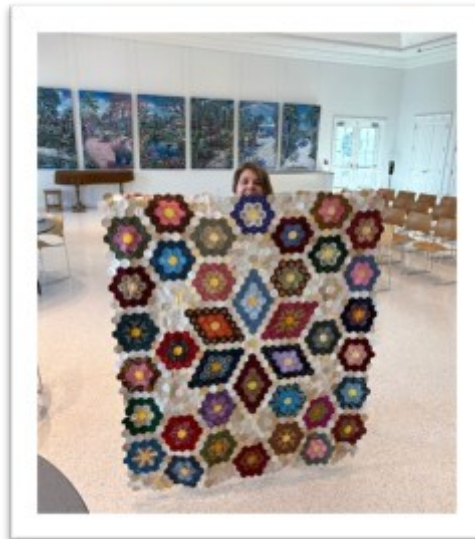

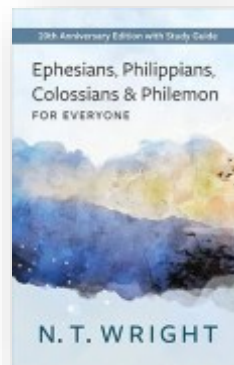

Sunday Adult Formation

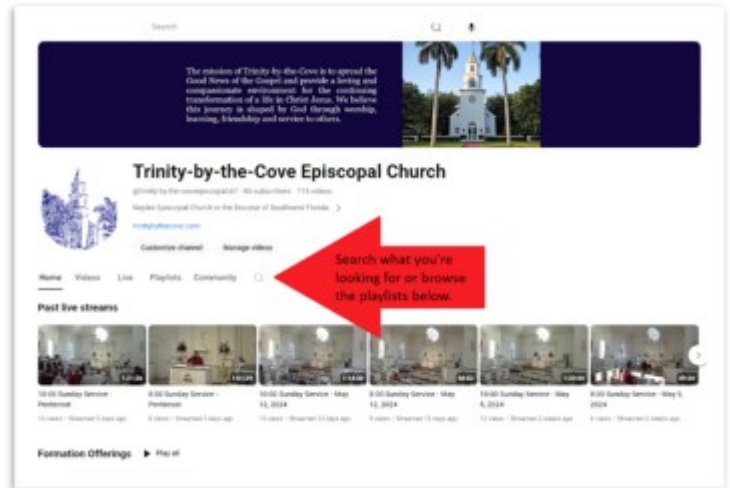

Choral Residency



In last month's Trinitarian I shared some historical background on Chichester Cathedral. For this issue I'll do the same for the other stop on this summer's Choral Residency - Southwark Cathedral. The choir will sing Evensong at Southwark on Saturday, August 15th, and then will sing both morning and evening services on Sunday, August 16th.

Southwark Cathedral, officially known as the Cathedral and Collegiate Church of St Saviour and St Mary Overie, is one of London's oldest Gothic churches and has served as a place of Christian worship for more than 1,000 years. Located beside London Bridge on the south bank of the Thames, the church traces its origins to a priory founded in the early medieval period, though much of the present structure dates from the 13th to 15th centuries. It was consecrated a Cathedral in 1905 in conjunction with the creation of the Diocese of Southwark.

Music has long been central to the

life of Southwark Cathedral. Though smaller in scale than some of England's great medieval cathedrals, it has developed a distinguished musical tradition known for both liturgical excellence and warmth of sound.

The cathedral choir sings regular Choral Evensong and Eucharists, continuing the Anglican heritage of daily sung prayer. Its acoustic—intimate yet resonant—supports both congregational singing and the clarity of choral repertoire ranging from Renaissance polyphony to contemporary works.



The cathedral also has strong associations with William Shakespeare. Located nearby the famous Globe Theatre, his brother Edmund is buried in the church and a memorial to William stands inside the cathedral. Another feature is the Harvard Chapel, commemorating Harvard University's founder John Harvard, who was baptized in the cathedral.

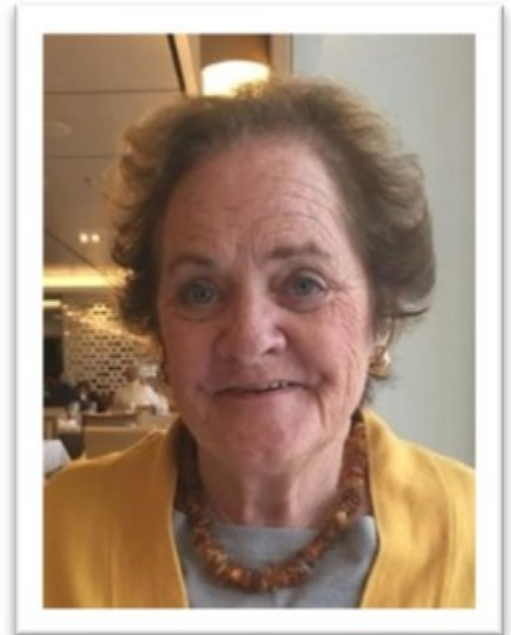
