Position Mission

To make disciples who worship, grow and service God, all for his glory by providing compassionate, clinically sound, and Gospel-centered counseling services and guiding individuals towards emotional, relational and psychological wholeness.

About the Position

The Director of Counseling provides visionary, clinical, and operational leadership for Christ the King's counseling ministry, The Barnabas Center. This individual will oversee the development and implementation of counseling services that reflect the vision, mission, and values of Christ the King Presbyterian Church. The Director will provide counseling services, supervise counseling staff and interns, cultivate strategic partnerships, and ensure The Barnabas Center operates with clinical excellence, organizational effectiveness, and Gospel-centered care.

Responsibilities

1. Operations and Administration

- Oversee day-to-day center operations, including scheduling systems, client intake processes, billing procedures, electronic health records, and regulatory compliance.
- Ensure adherence to all applicable state licensing, legal, ethical, and confidentiality requirements.
- Manage center finances, including budgeting, fee collection, scholarship funds, and third-party reimbursement processes.
- Monitor operational effectiveness and implement process improvements as needed.

2. Staff Supervision and Development

- Oversee administrative staff in support of the center's operations.
- Recruit, hire, onboard, supervise, and evaluate counseling staff and practicum students.
- Provide clinical supervision and licensure support as appropriate.
- Facilitate ongoing staff development through regular training, consultation, case review, and continuing education opportunities.
- Conduct regular performance evaluations and professional development planning.

3. Community Relations and Outreach

- Develop and implement strategies to increase awareness of The Barnabas Center services within Christ the King and surrounding community.
- Maintain collaborative relationships with local churches, counseling professionals, healthcare providers, psychiatrists, treatment programs, and community organizations.
- Represent The Barnabas Center at community events, professional organizations, and ministry partnerships.
- Oversee the creation and distribution of website content, social media presence, and other promotional communications.

4. Pastoral Care Collaboration

- Partner with pastors, elders, deacons, and ministry leaders to provide coordinated care for church members.
- Consult on pastoral care cases and provide recommendations for appropriate referrals and support.
- Assist in developing pathways for counseling assistance and care resources for members experiencing financial hardship or other needs.

5. Education and Training

- Develop educational materials and resources for church members, ministry leaders, and counseling staff.
- Provide training in mental health, relationships, spiritual formation, trauma, grief, and related counseling topics.
- Support Christ the King's mission through counseling-informed ministry initiatives.

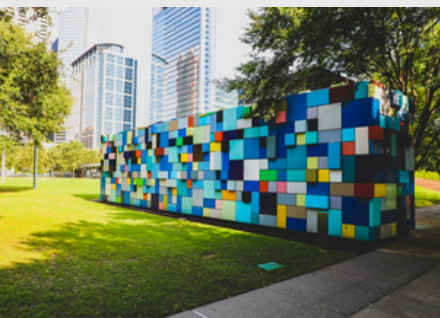
Skill Requirements

- Strong relational skills and the ability to build trust with clients, staff, and church leadership.
- Commitment to personal health, healthy boundaries, and sustainable ministry practices.
- Ability to remain calm, thoughtful, and effective during times of crisis or conflict.
- Passion for helping people experience healing and transformation through God's grace and truth in a counseling setting.

Qualifications/Education Requirements

- Approved clinical supervisor status or eligibility to provide supervision.
- Experience leading or managing a counseling practice, counseling center, or multi-disciplinary team.
- Experience in church-based or ministry-related counseling setting.
- Experience developing programs, managing budgets, and implementing operational systems.
- Demonstrated training and experience in trauma-informed care, couples counseling, and group facilitation.
- Active and unrestricted Texas licensure as an LPC, LMFT, Psychologist, or equivalent clinical license; supervisor licensure preferred.
- Master's degree or doctoral degree in Counseling, Marriage and Family Therapy, Psychology, or a related mental health field.
- Excellent leadership, organizational, interpersonal, and communication skills.

Houston was founded on August 30, 1836 by brothers Augustus Chapman Allen and John Kirby Allen on land near the banks of Buffalo Bayou.

Houston is the fourth most populous city in the nation, with an estimated July 2018 population of 2,325,502 (trailing only New York, Los Angeles and Chicago), and is the largest in the southern U.S. and Texas.

Houston is expected to become the third most populous U.S. city during the second half of the decade of the 2020s.

Greater Houston is the most ethnically diverse metropolitan area in the United States. At least 145 languages are spoken by city residents, and 90 nations have consular representation in the city.

The Houston-The Woodlands-Sugar Land Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) consists of nine counties: Austin, Brazoria, Chambers, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Liberty, Montgomery and Waller and covers 9,444 square miles, an area slightly smaller than Massachusetts but larger than New Jersey.

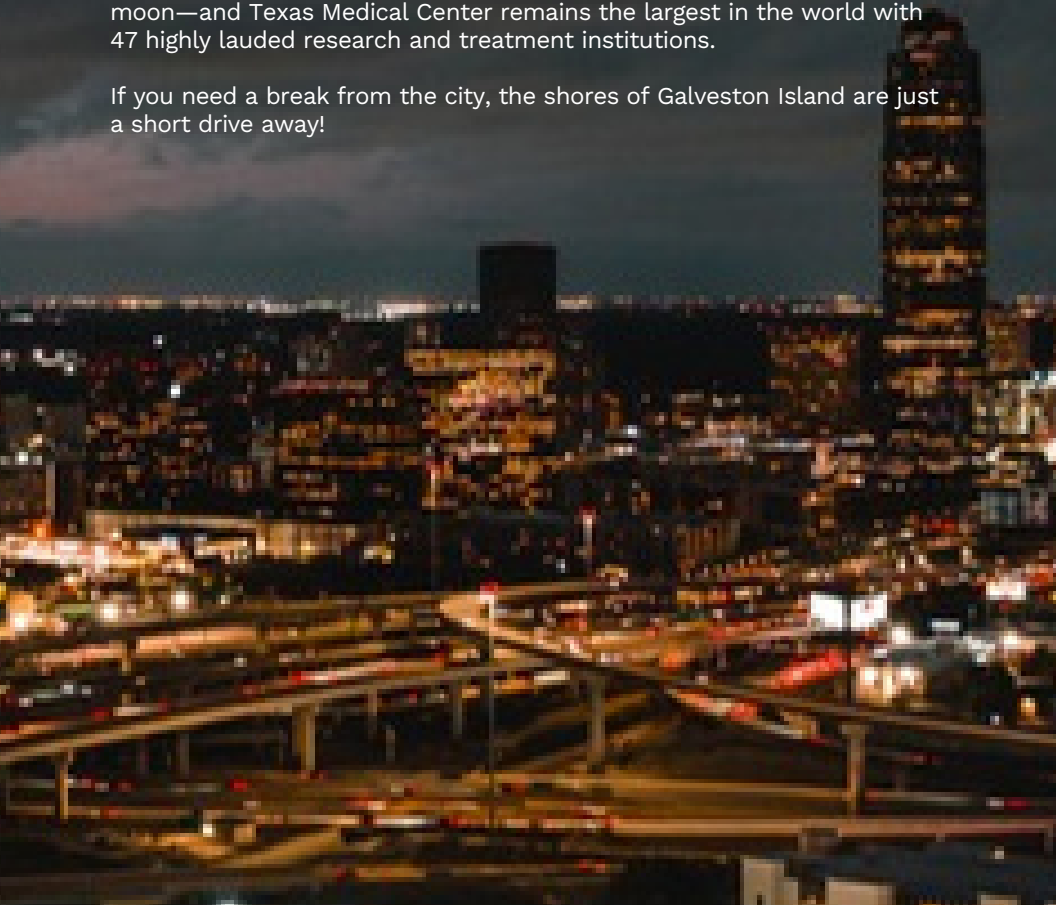
Houston has a diverse sports scene with many professional and college teams, including the Astros, Texans, Rockets, Dynamo, and Dash.

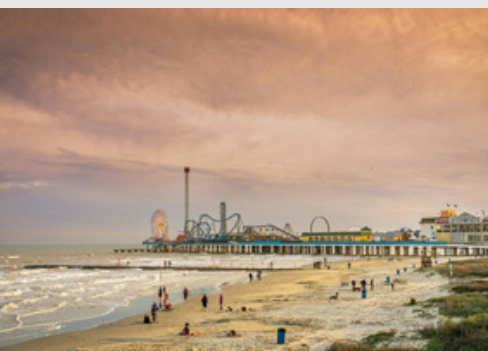
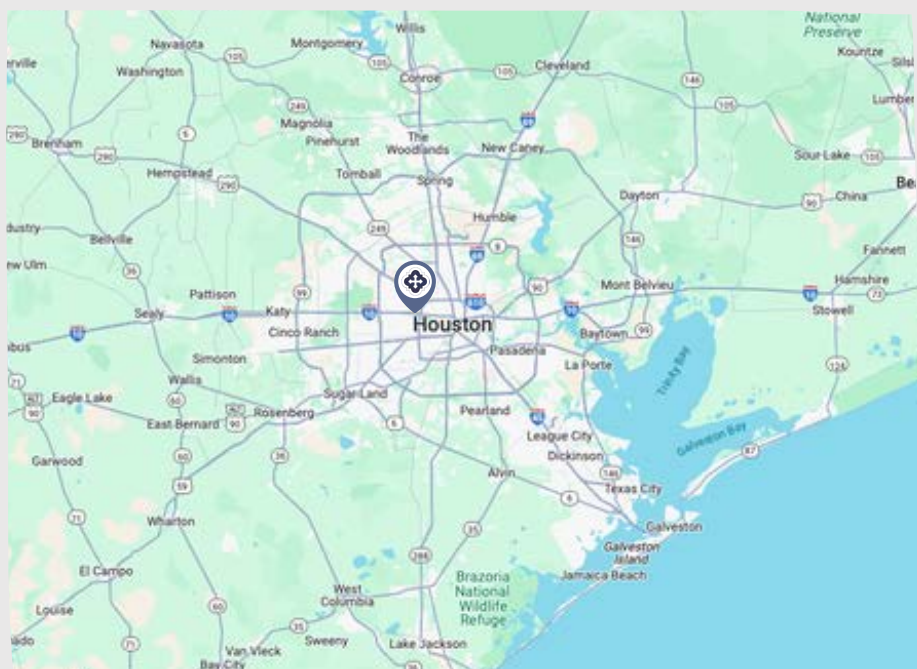
Houston also boasts a thriving professional arts scene, with resident companies in ballet, opera, symphony and theater. The Museum District stakes its claim as the country's fourth-largest, with 18 cultural powerhouses set within blocks of one another.

With 13,000 restaurants representing cuisine from more than 70 countries and American regions, Houston's restaurant scene is as ethnically diverse as its more than 6 million residents. In fact, Houston was named the "newest capital of great food" by Food & Wine and the country's most exciting food city by Tasting Table magazine.

Twenty-five companies on the Fortune 500 list call the Energy Capital of the World home. Aeronautic research is unsurpassed at NASA headquarters—the facility responsible for putting the first man on the moon—and Texas Medical Center remains the largest in the world with 47 highly lauded research and treatment institutions.
